INVESTIGATION:

On 12-December-2015, at the commencement of their regularly scheduled tour of duty, Detectives FULLER #20341 and AMATO #20340 were assigned to assist previously dispatched Area North Detectives, at the location of 5007 W. Wrightwood Street, by the on duty Violent Crimes Watch Commander, Sergeant T. MITCHELL #1888, of this command.

Sergeant MITCHELL informed the R/Dets, that first watch Detectives were at that time conducting an investigation into a burglary, and an attempt to disarm a Chicago Police Officer, which had occurred at that address, at approximately 0600 hours. He further informed them that during the course of this offense, shots had been fired by the victim Officer, whom he identified as P.O. Eduardo LOPEZ.

Upon receipt of this assignment the R/Dets departed from the Area Headquarters, arriving at the scene of this offense between 0745 and 0810 hours, approximately.

Upon arrival, the R/Dets observed numerous, marked, and unmarked Chicago Police vehicles parked in the area, as well as noting the presence of both uniformed Chicago Police Officers, and crime scene tape, protecting the investigative integrity of this scene.

They also learned that the scene was largely confined to the south alley of Wrightwood, where it lies between Lavergne Street to the east, and LeClaire Street to the west. Sharing a common alley with the south side of Wrightwood, is the north alley of Deming

At that time the R/Dets were also able to make the following observations with respect to the physical composition of this residential neighborhood, noting that it consists primarily of single family, bungalow style residences, in addition to a number of large, multi-unit apartment buildings, particularly where they line both sides of Lavergne and LeClaire Streets.

Detailing these streets further, Wrightwood itself was observed to be a one way, east-west, residential street that allows vehicular traffic to flow in an eastbound direction, where it crosses Lavergne. Lavergne is also a residential side street, that crosses Wrightwood just east of the location of this offense, and which permits southbound only, vehicular traffic, along its north-south axis, flowing toward Deming.

As noted above, the next street south of Wrightwood is Deming Street, which shares its north alley with that of the south alley of Wrightwood, and which is a one way W/B residential street, that continues to the west to LeClaire Street. LeClaire is also a residential street permitting northbound vehicular traffic.

Subsequent to their arrival, the R/Dets learned that the majority of this scene was located in the south alley of Wrightwood, behind the victim's residence. After some initial preliminary activities, the R/Dets relocated to the victims residence and met with the victim, Police Officer Eduardo LOPEZ.

The R/Dets requested that LOPEZ briefly escort them through this scene, pending a detailed interview with him, to be conducted by the R/Dets at Area North.

P.O. LOPEZ then escorted the R/Dets from his residence and through his back yard to the area of his garage and rear gate. The R/Dets noted at that time that the rear gate of LOPEZ'S residence, which allows access to the alley from his rear yard, was securely closed and fastened. The R/Dets also observed that the service door of the premises detached garage, was standing open, and observed hanging from the door knob lock, was one set of keys.

Entering into the garage itself, the R/Dets then observed a white Dodge SUV within and further observed the overhead garage door open. Proceeding through the garage and out through the open overhead door into the alley, the R/Dets next observed, located a

short distance west of the garage, in the alley at approximately 5017 W. Wrightwood, two Chicago Police Department, yellow crime scene markers, where LOPEZ stated he had discharged his weapon.

Approaching these markers on foot more closely, the R/Dets observed a quantity of freshly broken automotive glass strewn among them. These markers, which had been placed by the responding preliminary investigators, denoted the position of two, discharged "PNC" .380 caliber, shell casings.

This evidence was subsequently collected by the assigned Evidence Technician, Roy KAWASAKI #15723, MB 5834 and along with his other activities, was later documented by him on a Crime Scene Processing Report.

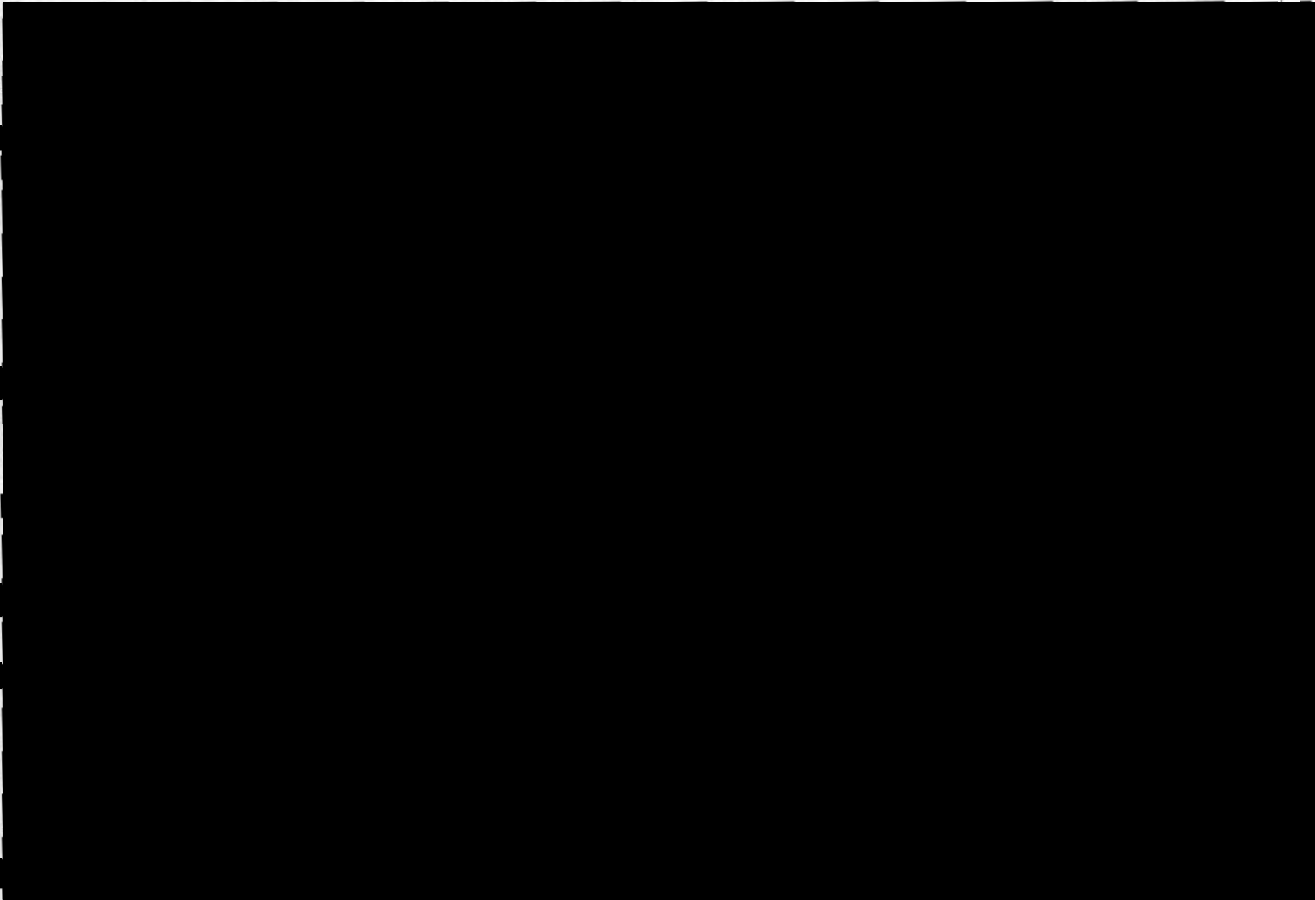
During the course of their scene activities, the R/Dets learned that responding Detective Division personnel had located a number of surveillance cameras in the area, believed to have possibly captured images germane to this investigation. As a result, Sergeant B. HOLY #2525, Detective Division scene supervisor, directed that efforts be made to obtain these images, and assigned personnel, as appropriate, for this task.

In addition to the Detective Division personnel already present, a request was dispatched to have a member of the Chicago Police Departments, Technical Lab arrive, and assist in these activities. P.O. David HEPPNER #19907 subsequently responded to this summons.

Concluding their general scene observations with Officer LOPEZ, it was learned from the O.C.I.C., Commander Maria PENA, that an Internal Affairs Division Sergeant was then present at Area North, awaiting the arrival of Police Officer LOPEZ for the purpose of performing his mandatory, post-shooting protocol. LOPEZ therefore departed from this location and was provided with transportation to Area North for the purpose of meeting with the IAD representative.

At this time, the weapon identified by LOPEZ as his, "Glock" Model 42, .380 semi-auto pistol, bearing serial number [REDACTED] and which was used during this incident was secured, and inventoried by the assigned Evidence Technician.

Concluding this interview, the R/Dets departed the scene, and returned to Area North, where Police Office LOPEZ was awaiting their return, in order to be interviewed. The following is a summary of the interview with LOPEZ, and the R/Dets, conducted at 1315 hours in the Area North, Cold Case Homicide Office.

LOPEZ, Eduardo:

Police Officer LOPEZ stated that he had returned home from work and gone to bed at approximately 2200 hours, on 11-December-2015. He stated that he was sleeping with his wife, [REDACTED] when she awakened him at approximately 0600 hours, screaming. He related that he got up out of bed and she informed him that there were people burglarizing their garage.

He stated that he then got dressed and instructed his wife to immediately call 911. He stated he went to the rear window of his home and observed lights from within his garage. LOPEZ armed himself and then went out his back door. LOPEZ stated that while approaching his garage, observed the lights he had previously seen, go out. He stated that as he neared to the garage, he could hear movement within.

LOPEZ then unlocked his service door and entered into his garage where he observed a male Hispanic, 19-25 years of age, on the other side of his parked truck, holding property belonging to him. He then related that he next looked to his left and observed a second male Hispanic, approximately 5'08 in height and weighing 135-150 pounds, standing to his immediate left, holding his "Dewalt" 18 volt drill (Not recovered). LOPEZ stated that he then yelled "Police" and heard in response, one of the two offenders state, "Oh, shit!"

LOPEZ reported that both subjects then fled the garage on foot, via the open overhead garage door, with the subject previously holding the drill, still fleeing with it in his possession.

Eduardo LOPEZ stated he immediately initiated a foot pursuit when he noted a parked, running car located at approximately 5017 W. Wrightwood. He stated that the first offender, whom he initially observed standing on the other side of his parked vehicle, ran past the stopped, running auto and continued W/B on foot through the alley, towards LeClaire.

Officer LOPEZ stated that he then observed the second subject run to the driver's side door, which was standing open, of the

running car. He stated that as he neared it, he could now see that it was a station wagon type vehicle, and that its rear hatch up. He further stated that as he drew even closer to the car he could see that its interior was filled with property. Police Officer LOPEZ stated that as the offender entered into the drivers seat through the open door, he was able to approach, and using his left hand, prevented the offender from closing the door.

LOPEZ stated that he then yelled, "Chicago Police, stop, stop" with the intention of placing this offender in custody, when the offender, while still seated in the station wagon, turned in his seat, and facing the Officer, extended his left arm out and swung it at him, striking LOPEZ before grabbing Officer LOPEZ by the right wrist.

LOPEZ stated that he was holding his 'Glock' semi-auto pistol in his right hand at the time and believed that this physical assault was an attempt to disarm him. LOPEZ stated the offender was still grabbing him near to his right hand when he attempted to disengage from him by pulling his arm back and stepping away from the offender, who was still hanging on to LOPEZ, and fearing he was going to lose control of his weapon, discharged three rapid succession shots at the offender.

LOPEZ related that while attempting to physically maintain control of the gun, he believes that one of the rounds he discharged likely broke the rear, driver's side door window (seating position behind the driver), accounting for the presence of freshly broken automotive glass discovered at the scene of the shooting.

LOPEZ related that he is unable to say with absolute certainty if he struck this subject, but is reasonably certain that he did not.

LOPEZ stated that the offender immediately pulled away from him still seated in the auto, spilling cargo from its open hatch back as it did so, while fleeing W/B through the alley. LOPEZ stated that he continued to observe the auto as it neared to the mouth of the alley at LeClaire, and saw it stop, where it paused momentarily while the other offender, who had previously remained on foot, entered into the vehicle, which then turned N/B onto LeClaire, and out of his sight.

Having concluded his account, the R/Dets next directed LOPEZ'S attention to the period of time after the burglary subjects had successfully fled from the scene.

Eduardo LOPEZ responded by saying that his wife joined him in the alley where she received a telephone call from the 911 center. While she was on the phone, he instructed her to inform the emergency operator that a Chicago Police Officer had discharged his weapon, before subsequently taking the phone from her himself. LOPEZ provided the Emergency Operator, with his Chicago Police Star number and Offender description(s).

Eduardo LOPEZ stated that both he and his wife recognized much of the property, which had fallen out of the rear of the wagon and which was laying in the alley, belonged to them. Eduardo LOPEZ stated that he requested that his wife leave this property where it was, pending the arrival of the police. He stated that despite this request, he later observed her pick up these items and return them to their garage.

LOPEZ stated that he recognized one of these items, an 'HDX finish nail kit' as not having come from within his garage, but rather as having come from the trunk of his 1996 Honda automobile, which was parked on the street, around the corner from his home, at approximately 2552 N. Lavergne. LOPEZ related that he walked to his car and discovered that even though he himself had parked and locked it, days before, the driver's front door was now unlocked.

LOPEZ further related that he inspected the interior of his vehicle, and discovered that his remote garage door opener, which was customarily attached to his driver's side, sun visor was missing. LOPEZ surmised that it was with the use of this remote, that the offenders subsequently gained entry into his garage. Investigating further, he noted that missing from the trunk of the Honda, the offenders, in addition to taken his finish nail kit, had also taken his "Asp" expandable police baton, and two metal pocket knives.

P.O. LOPEZ stated despite searching the area he was unable to find this garage door opener, which has still not been recovered, at the time of the authorship of this report.

The R/Dets who had previously obtained, and reviewed a copy of audio of the relevant 911 phone calls, requested LOPEZ to listen to a portion of one of these calls, in an attempt to clarify statements made by him at that time. This 'Disc' containing the 911 radio calls and transmissions was subsequently inventoried by the undersigned, under INV# 1359 4202.

After listening to this transmission, Officer LOPEZ made the following clarifying declarations in response to questions posed by the R/Dets.

Eduardo LOPEZ was asked how many offenders had been involved in this incident. LOPEZ stated that it was now his clear recollection that he had only seen two subjects. LOPEZ acknowledged that although the tape indicates he told the 911 operator at the time, that there had been three offenders, at the time of this interview he was clear and unequivocal in his recollection that there had only been two. LOPEZ also stated that he had no memory of telling the operator there had been three involved offenders, and noted that the clothing description provided by him for two of them was virtually identical.

Another portion of this tape is nearly inaudible, with one possible interpretation of his transmission being that he had indicated that the offender's vehicle had "backed" in his direction. Eduardo LOPEZ was asked specifically if he recalled the offender and his

auto, reversing at him.

Police Officer LOPEZ stated that he is now certain that this was not the case, and does not believe that is what he informed the 911 operator at the time.

At the conclusion of this interview, arrangements were made to have an Evidence Technician respond to the Area Headquarters and collect, and inventory the victim's shirt, for later analysis. At the conclusion of that activity, LOPEZ was provided a ride home.

Subsequent to these activities, the R/Dets met with Detective Adam KATZ, who, along with Police Officer David HEPPNER (Tech Lab), had recovered video from several locations in the vicinity of this incident. Detective KATZ, who was also assisted by Area North Detective VOGLER, reviewed their video findings with the R/Dets, which are summarized below.

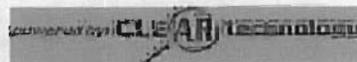
At approximately 07:03:48, a male subject wearing grey jogging pants, a dark colored hooded sweatshirt, and multi colored gym shoes is depicted, running westbound, through the south alley of Wrightwood.

At approximately 07:03:50, a grey, or possibly tan, four door mid-sized station wagon, with a roof rack, and dark colored body molding, driving at a high rate of speed, is depicted, travelling westbound, through the south alley of Wrightwood.

Det. KATZ then viewed the video obtained from the camera located on the east side of the residence facing, southbound, towards the alley. In this video an unknown offender on foot is observed to be running westbound through the alley, followed by the grey or tan colored station wagon type vehicle, with the rear hatchback section of the vehicle in the fully open position.

Beat 6590F, P.O. D. HEPPNER #19907, arrived on the scene and recovered the surveillance video, which was subsequently inventoried in accordance with existing department procedures, under Chicago Police Department Inventory Number 13590217.

At the conclusion of these recovery efforts, Det. KATZ and P.O. HEPPNER learned of additional residential addresses, in close proximity to the scene, where potential video evidence existed. As a result, Det. KATZ and P.O. HEPPNER relocated to 2534 N. Lavergne, Apartment 2S, in an attempt to recover surveillance video from this location.



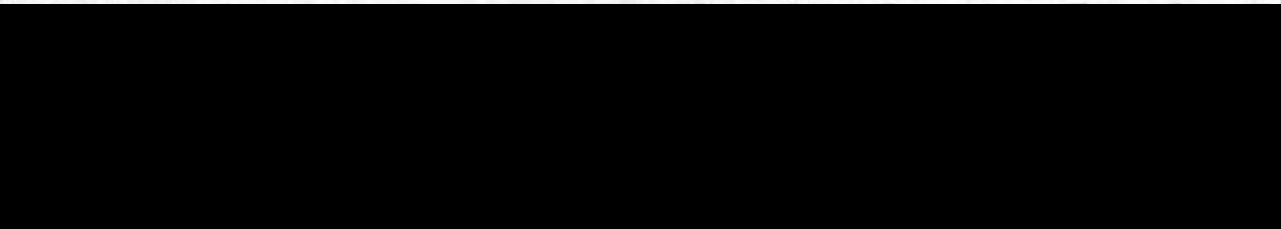
VIDEO:

At approximately 0706 hours, a station wagon type vehicle, travelling southbound on Lavergne Avenue, stops just north of the alley, between Wrightwood Avenue and Deming Place.

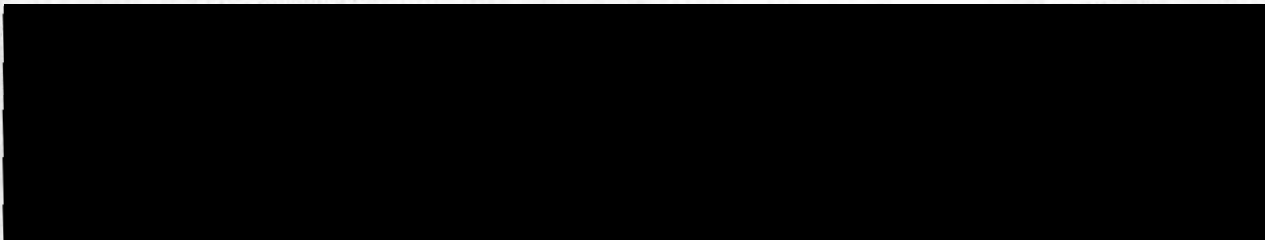
Approximately one minute elapses, at which time the vehicle is noted to back up a short distance, before coming to a stop, once again. When it does so, this vehicle is stopped in close proximity to Eduardo LOPEZ'S, parked Honda automobile, from which, it is believed that the door opener used by the offenders to gain access to LOPEZ garage was taken.

The vehicle remains stationary at this location for approximately one additional minute, before pulling away, travelling southbound, on Lavergne Avenue. The vehicle then executes a right turn from Lavergne Avenue and continues westbound into the south alley of Wrightwood, towards the victim's garage, driving out of video cameras range.

This video was recovered by P.O. HEPPNER and tendered to Det. KATZ. It was subsequently inventoried in accordance with existing department procedures, under Chicago Police Department Inventory Number 13590238.



Det. KATZ viewed the video in its entirety, eventually determining that there was nothing of evidentiary value captured on the system, at this time. P.O. HEPPNER recovered this video which was subsequently inventoried by Det. KATZ under Chicago Police Department Inventory Number 13590245. A copy of this video, as well as the other recovered videos obtained in connection with this investigation, has been retained as a part of the permanent case file.



The R/Dets have since requested that the Illinois State Police Crime Lab, conduct a direct physical comparison between Eduardo LOPEZ'S Glock pistol, to the spent .380 caliber shell casings, recovered in the alley under I.S.P. Submission Form 60619. Pending the identification of a likely offender in this incident, the R/Dets are deferring any biologic requests to I.S.P., until such time as a direct comparison can be performed between an offender, and the evidence recovered in this matter.
