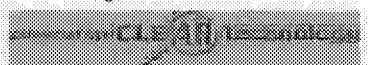

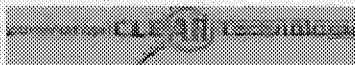

Investigation: The reporting Detectives received the assignment of a Police involved shooting at 63rd and California Ave. Reporting Detectives proceeded to the scene which had been taped off by 008th District Police personnel.

While on scene R/D's conducted an interview with the victim Officer MANGUERRA #14098. The following interview should be considered in summary.

MANGUERRA related that on 22 NOV 2012 at approximately 1605 Hrs he was working in uniform in a marked Chicago Police vehicle. MANGUERRA related that as he was travelling on California he was flagged down by a citizen at approximately 6253 S. California. MANGUERRA related the citizen informed him that there was a man on the bus beating people up. MANGUERRA related that he exited his vehicle and approached a CTA bus which was parked on California facing northbound. MANGUERRA related he then observed a male black, muscular build, exit the bus and begin to walk towards him. MANGUERRA related he told the subject to stop and get back. MANGUERRA related the offender subsequently ran towards him and lunged in his direction. MANGUERRA related that he then in fear for his life and the life of others he fired multiple times at the offender. MANGUERRA related the offender subsequently fell to the ground. That concluded the interview with MANGUERRA.

R/D's then conducted a tour of the crime scene located at 6253 S. California. R/D's observed California to be a two lane major street that travels north and south. California at 6253 S., is geographically encompassed by 62nd St to the north, 63rd St. to the south, Fairfield to the east and Mozart to the west. The area consists primarily of commercial businesses and multi unit apartment buildings.

R/D's observed the crime scene to be cordoned off by yellow exterior crime scene tape extended from 6240 to 6300 S. California, and red interior crime scene tape from 6242 to 6258 S. California. R/D's observed the crime scene to be guarded by BT 824, PO PREUS #16696 and PO ARELLANO #17016.

R/D's observed Chicago Transit Authority Bus #6641 parked on California facing northbound. R/D's observed Marked Chicago

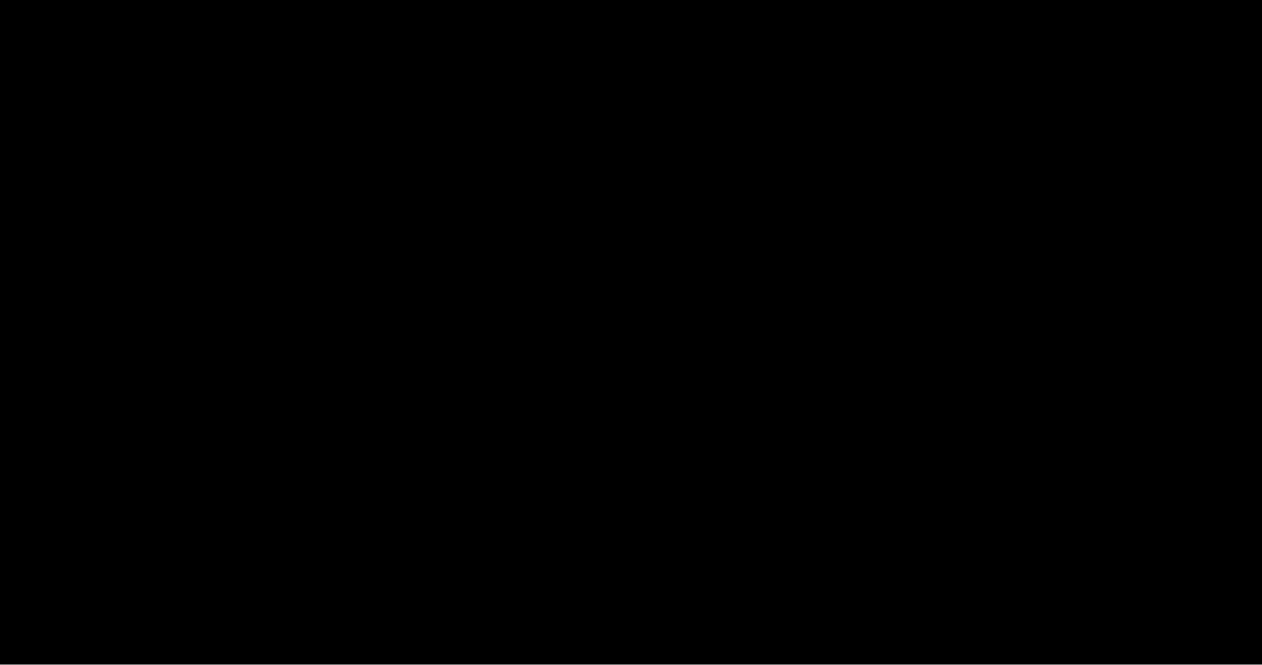

Police Vehicle #8171 bearing BT 5813, parked on California facing southeast towards Bus #6641. R/D's observed apparent blood on the front driver's side door and blood located just beneath the front driver's side door of Police Vehicle #8171.

R/D's observed two 9MM expended shell casings lying in the street at 6253 S. California. R/D's observed apparent blood located on the street near the curb at 6253 S. California.

R/D's then entered Chicago Transit Authority Bus #8171 and observed lying on the handicapped benched seat located on what would be the passenger side of the bus, a black colored Old Navy vest size XL, white colored athletic shirt, black and white hooded sweatshirt, cigarette lighter and a hand rolled cigarette. R/D's then observed laying on the floor just beneath that a pack of Newport cigarettes.

R/D's then observed two exterior surveillance cameras located on the west wall of the Currency Exchange located at 2756 W. 63rd St.



NARRATIVES

Detective KELLER arrived on scene and learned from Sgt. McGAVOCK that responding Chicago Fire Department personnel on scene may have witnessed the incident. Detective KELLER conducted the following interviews:

Lt John KNIGHTLY related that he was on CFD Truck #41 and responding to a battery victim on a bus job. The fire truck pulled up facing northbound and parallel to the CTA bus. At almost the same time, a Chicago Police squad car arrived facing southbound. The squad car stopped in front of the CTA bus. KNIGHTLY exited the fire truck and observed the Police Officer by himself. KNIGHTLY related that he was standing near the front of the CTA bus when he observed to his right was a male black, stocky build, fists clenched, and who was acting in an "aggressive manner". KNIGHTLY heard this subject muttering and yelling, but was unable to hear the wording. KNIGHTLY related that the subject charged at the Police Officer. The Police Officer gave several verbal commands to the subject to stop. The subject walked towards the bus as KNIGHTLY called for a "10-1" (emergency assistance).

The subject turned back around and charged the Police Officer for a second time as the Police Officer again gave several verbal commands to the subject. The subject stopped and turned back around towards the CTA bus. KNIGHTLY related that he told the CTA bus driver to shut the doors to the bus. The subject reached the bus and turned back around towards the Police Officer. The subject clinched his fists, dropped his shoulder, and went into a "tackle stance" as he charged the Police Officer for a third time. The Police Officer gave several verbal commands to the subject. The subject ignored the commands and continued at the Police Officer as the Police Officer fired (2) times towards the subject. KNIGHTLY added that he believed the subject was "fixated" on the Police Officer the entire time.

KNIGHTLY related that the subject was on the ground and acting very irate with "extreme rage". The subject was still attempting to get up while yelling. KNIGHTLY observed responding Police Officers arrive on scene and subject was "Tasered". KNIGHTLY related that he assisted in transporting subject into the ambulance as the subject fought the entire time. KNIGHTLY related that a battery victim was located on the CTA bus, so KNIGHTLY requested another ambulance.



John HARAN related that he was standing near Lt. KNIGHTLY in front of the fire truck. HARAN observed a male black subject pacing around in an aggressive manner while "rambling". The subject charged at the Police Officer as HARAN heard the Police Officer give the subject several verbal commands to "get down". The subject paced back towards the bus and charged at the Police Officer for a second time. Once again, the Police Officer gave several verbal commands towards the subject. The subject turned around and went back towards the bus. HARAN related that the bus driver shut the doors to the bus. HARAN related that the subject turned around, appeared focused on the Police Officer, and charged at the Police Officer as if he was going to perform a "football tackle" to the Police Officer. The Police Officer gave several verbal commands; which were ignored. The Police Officer fired his weapon towards the subject.

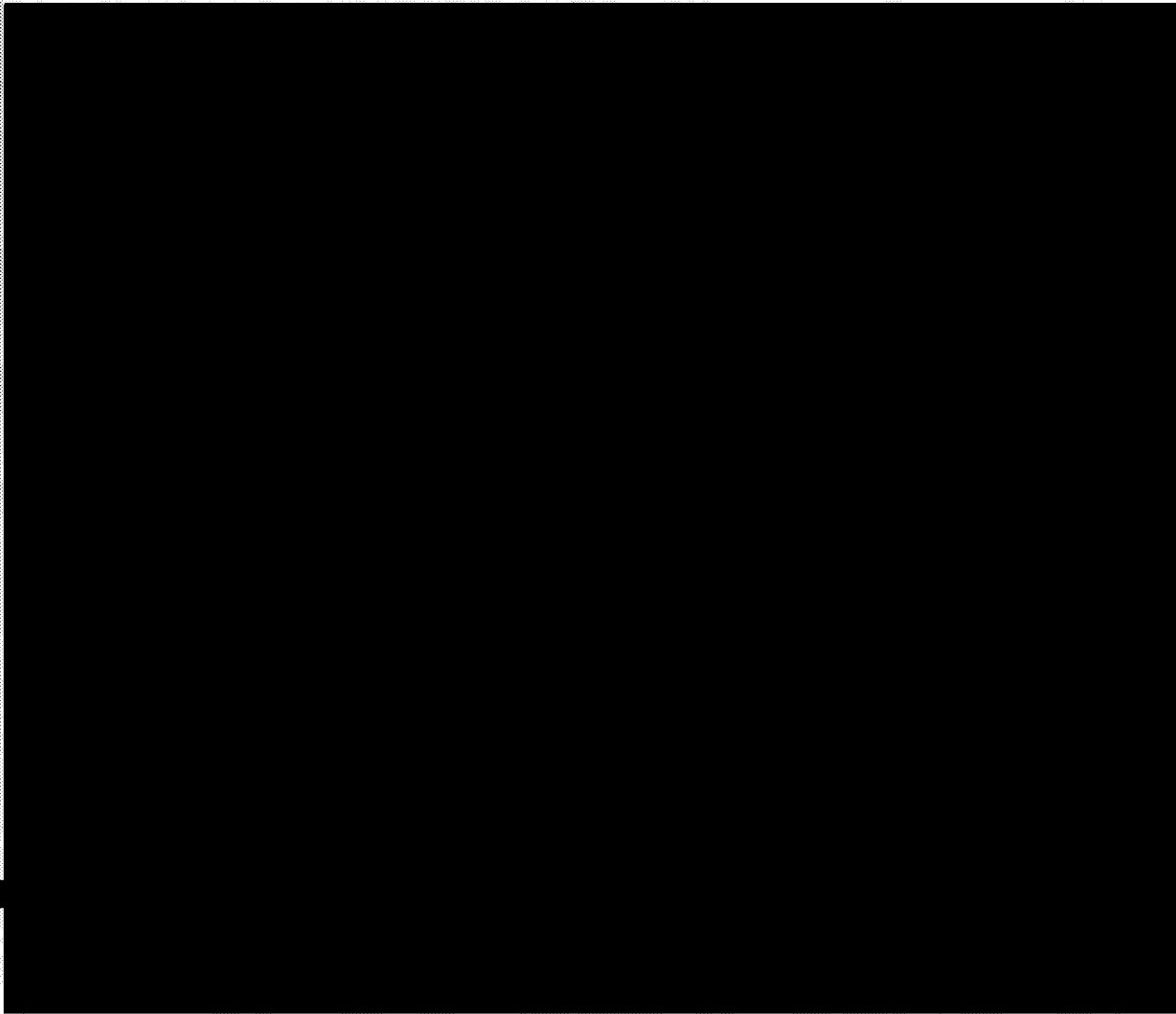
HARAN related that subject was "Tasered" and continued to fight inside the ambulance.

Joseph SOLCANI related that he was driving the fire truck and pulled up next to the bus. The Police Officer exited his vehicle and SOLCANI heard the Police Officer yell "Back up, Get down." SOLCANI observed a subject charge at the Police Officer a couple of times. SOLCANI exited the fire truck and went to the rear of the fire truck to retrieve equipment. SOLCANI related that he was near the rear of the fire truck and CTA bus when he heard gunshots.

SOLCANI related that the subject was "Tasered" by a responding Police Officer. SOLCANI assisted in moving the subject into the ambulance as the subject was fighting.

Guadalupe BARRERA related that the subject observed was very aggressive and he "attacked" the Police Officer a couple of times. BARRERA heard the Police Officer give the subject numerous verbal commands to stop. The subject then attacked the Police Officer again and the Police Officer fired at the subject.

NARRATIVES

On 22-Nov-2012 at approximately 1640 hours, Det. McDermott #21084 interviewed P.O. Solner #4711. This interview took place in the parking lot of the Marathon gas station at XXXX W. 63rd St. The following is a summary of this interview.

P.O. Solner stated the following:

P.O. Solner related he and his partner, P.O. Lule #9702, were working Bt. 821. P.O. Solner and P.O. Lule were traveling northbound on California Ave responding to a call of, "Fighting on a bus/bus alarm". Upon arrival, P.O. Solner observed the offender, KNA Ismaeel JAMISON. P.O. Solner related JAMISON was not wearing a shirt and was very large and muscular, and appeared to be ready to pounce or fight. P.O. Solner and his partner exited their car then observed JAMISON charge the victim, E.T. Manguerra #14098. P.O. Solner related that as JAMISON got to approximately an arms length of E.T. Manguerra, E.T. Manguerra fired his handgun twice, striking JAMISON. JAMISON immediately tried to get back on his feet, and JAMISON told P.O. Solner's partner to, "Shoot him again". P.O. Solner and his partner then placed handcuffs on one (1) of JAMISON'S wrists. At this point, JAMISON struggled and freed himself from the officers' grasp and he again tried to stand up and JAMISON was subsequently tasered again. JAMISON was then placed into a responding CFD ambulance by both CFD and CPD personnel. P.O. Solner could add nothing further at this time and Det. McDermott concluded this interview.

LT Wojcik #1481 responded to Christ Hospital and interviewed the offender Ismaeel JAMISON. LT Wojcik read JAMISON his Miranda rights and JAMISON waived said rights. JAMISON related that the bus driver called him an ass hole and when JAMISON got off the bus the Police shot him. LT Wojcik advised JAMISON that video had been obtained from the CTA bus and JAMISON stated the following. JAMISON stated "I'm sorry I got angry and lost it, I went after the police officer because I knew I was going back to the joint anyway". JAMISON stated "I told the officer I was going to kill him and I got shot.

JAMISON was being treated by Dr. [REDACTED] in serious condition with a GSW to the left chest and right foot.

Reporting Detectives requested forensic services and BT 5802 F.I. BRASIC #10201 and F.I. SMITH #17100 responded to process the scene.

Reporting Detectives requested an evidence technician and BT 5822 E.T. NORRIS #19686 responded to Area Central to photograph the injuries of the victim [REDACTED]

NARRATIVES

While in Area 1, Detective BENIGNO #20807 spoke with PO PHILLIPS #9514, PO BLAIR #18771 and PO MCINERNEY #18282. These Officers accompanied the offender to Christ Medical Center inside CFD Ambulance #8. While en route the offender repeatedly attempted to escape the ambulance and fight with paramedics. PO MCINERNEY #18282 subsequently tasered the offender three times so paramedics could strap the offender to a medical board. Paramedics then contacted Christ Medical Center to ensure that Hospital security would be awaiting there arrival due to the violent nature of the offender.

The Reporting Detectives contacted the cook county States Attorneys office and ASA Mary INNIS and ASA Naheda ZAYYAD responded to Area Central. ASA INNIS and ASA ZAYYAD were appraised to the facts of the case and interviewed witnesses. ASA INNIS continued this investigation pending interview of [REDACTED] additional witnesses and the offender. Aggravated battery charges pending.

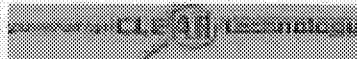
