

**Investigation:**

**Lieutenant A**, related that while **Officer A** was trying to secure his holster, he pulled the trigger of his assigned Taser. No injuries or damages occurred. **Officer A** completed a TRR documenting the Taser discharge. In a To/From report dated 16 May 2017, **Officer A** acknowledged that while attempting to attach the Taser holder with his left hand to his duty belt and holding the Taser with his right hand, his finger accidentally hit the trigger causing a discharge. **Officer A** related that he has since learned that the Taser holder he used was not sufficient for his duty belt because the holder attachment was too small for his duty belt. **Officer A** has since corrected the issue and now knows one size does not fit all. At the time of this discharge, **Officer A's** Taser qualification was up to date and not expiring until February 2017.

**Conclusion:**

The Reporting Investigator recommends a finding of Sustained for the allegation that **Officer A** was inattentive to duty in that he failed to properly handle a Taser causing it to discharge. **Officer A** was solely responsible for the proper handling of the Taser.
