RE: Transparency Release of Records for Log No.1085722 on August 25, 2017

Dear Mr. Siskel:

The Independent Police Review Authority (IPRA) requests a thirty (30) day extension of the release of certain documents and audio and video recordings relating to IPRA Log 1085722. The City of Chicago Video Release Policy (the "Policy") requires that certain records related to incidents involving death or great bodily harm resulting from an encounter with a member of the Chicago Police Department be released within sixty (60) days from the date of the incident. The incident that is the subject of the above-captioned Log number occurred on June 27, 2017. As such, pursuant to the Policy, certain records relating to the incident are scheduled to be released on August 25, 2017.

Specifically, pursuant to the Policy, IPRA is scheduled to release: an original case incident report, 911 call audio recordings, dispatch audio recordings, and video recordings. IPRA agrees with the release of the original case incident report and the 911 calls related to the incident as scheduled. However, IPRA's investigation of the incident is ongoing and has determined that release of the other materials at this time would: (1) interfere with active administrative enforcement proceedings; (2) obstruct an ongoing criminal investigation; and (3) create a substantial likelihood that a person will be deprived of a fair trial or an impartial hearing. As such, pursuant to the Policy, IPRA herein requests an additional thirty (30) days in which to make the public disclosure of the remaining audio and video recordings.
