

Body Worn Camera (BWC) Video4: COPA requested, obtained and reviewed Body-Worn Camera video from officers involved with this incident. The only available videos were from the Body-Worn Camera of Officer and Officer and Officer. The following is a summary of

again, asks Mr. to come outside. Mr. refuses to comply. Officer explains he is going to have Mr. come to his car, so a namecheck can be performed. Mr. again refuses to comply. Officer tells Mr. to come to the car or he will be going to jail. Mr. responds, "No." Mr. then agrees to start moving outside. Officer walks Mr. to his squad and asks one of two officers standing outside to run Mr. s name.
Officer confirms that Mr. wants Mr. to go to court on this case. Officer asks Mr. to recount what occurred. Mr. recounts the same version of events he told Officer when he initially arrived. Officer relocates outside to get a criminal complaint and returns to Mr. who signs his name to the same.
Officer then asks Mr. if he wants to keep his stuff or if he wants to leave it at the house. Mr. states he didn't hit anyone. Officer enters the squad car and comments about the smell of alcohol in the car. Mr. responds it is from him, as he has been drinking all night. Upon their arrival at the police station, states that Officer is lying and asks another officer to call his attorney or 911.
Officer Body Worn Camera Video – Officer (Officer around outside incident location and walks up to the driveway with his flashlight and walks around outside incident location.
Officer walks towards Officer and Mr. and tells Mr. to just have a seat in the car. Mr. states he didn't do anything, and he shouldn't be going anywhere. Officer opens the door and asks Mr. for his ID and address. Mr. states that they are all felons in that house. He claims they stole money from him and everything. Mr. explains it is like a halfway house. He states he pays \$450 per month for rent and adds, but they are felons and they are criminals.

The Event Number is recorded as and the date and time of the event is March 18, 2018 and the time is 7:21:39 pm. Records from the Circuit Court Clerk of Cook County reflect that criminal case arising from
this incident, was dismissed with leave to reinstate on April 2, 2018 because the complaining witness did not appear in court. ¹⁴
VI. ANALYSIS
The Fourth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution protects individuals against unreasonable seizures. The facts surrounding the detention and arrest of establish that his detention and subsequent arrest were within the bounds of the law and Chicago Police Department policy.
Allegation #1: Unlawfully detained and arrested in violation of Rule 1
On March 18, 2018, Officer Officer responded to a call of a person with a knife at the location of Chicago, Illinois. After conducting a preliminary investigation, which included speaking with and Officer arrested for the offense of aggravated assault with a knife.


A police officer many temporarily detain an individual for an investigatory stop when "the officer's decision is based on specific, articulable facts which warrant the investigative stop intrusion." *People v. Moore*, 286 Ill. App. 3d 649, 653 (3d Dist. 1997) (citing *Terry v. Ohio*, 392 U.S. 1, 21, (1968)); *People v. Stewart*, 242 Ill. App. 3d 599, 605 (1993)). "The police officer must have an 'articulable suspicion' that the person has committed or is about to commit a crime. *Moore*, 286 Ill. App. 3d at 653 (citations omitted). An officer may not detain an individual based on mere hunches or unparticularized suspicions. *Id.* (citations omitted).

An officer must have probable cause to arrest a subject. *People v. Johnson*, 408 Ill. App. 3d 107 (citing *Beck v. Ohio*, 379 U.S. 89, 91, (1964)). "Probable cause to arrest exists when the totality of the facts and circumstances known to a police officer would lead a person of reasonable caution to believe that the person apprehended has committed a crime, and its existence depends on the totality of the circumstances at the time of the arrest." *People v. D.W. (In re D.W.)*, 341 Ill. App. 3d 517, 526 (1st Dist. 2003). The officer's subjective belief is not determinative; rather probable cause is an objective standard. *People v. Chapman*, 194 Ill. 2d 186, 218-19, (2000).

Chapter 750 Section 60/301 (a) of the Illinois Compiled Statute provides, in relevant part:

Any law enforcement officer may make an arrest without warrant if the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed or is committing any crime...even if the crime was not committed in the presence of the officer. (emphasis added)

However, there is no evidence that Officer conducted a custodial interrogation and therefore Officers and were not required to provide his Miranda Rights. Furthermore, the available evidence demonstrates that was provided medical treatment on March 19, 2018.
