


Body Worn Camera (BWC) ⁶ video from March 23, 2018, captured Officer

The Initiation Report, authored by Sergeant detailed the initial investigation into a Domestic Battery Incident Report that involved Officer and his wife.

The detective interviewed who stated the incident occurred in her home
and in the presence of her two children. Mrs. said that after leaving work, Officer
went out drinking with friends and arrived home at approximately 5:00 am. Later that
morning, Mrs. asked Officer to take the children to school and an argument
ensued. Officer wanted to keep the children home and Mrs. wanted them
to go to school. As Mrs. was about to leave with the children, Officer
grabbed Mrs. around her neck and pulled by her hair. Officer grabbed
backpack from her hand and proceeded to block the front door and prevent Mrs.
and the children from leaving the house. Mrs. began to yell for help and
that's when Officer allowed Mrs. and the children to leave. Mrs.
did not want to pursue prosecution and only wanted the incident to be reported. Mrs.
was not injured, and the children were not harmed.
The detectives interviewed and who related they had witnessed their parents fighting
that morning. No injuries were observed to both children and they appeared to be in good health.


