¹ On September 15, 2017, the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA) replaced the Independent Police Review Authority (IPRA) as the civilian oversight agency of the Chicago Police Department. Therefore, this investigation, which began under IPRA, was transferred to COPA on September 15, 2017, and the recommendation(s) set forth herein are the recommendation(s) of COPA.

II. SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE²

Officers ██████ and ██████ curbed ██████ in his personal vehicle, a red Chevrolet Tahoe, because his vehicle did not have a rear license plate. After curbing ██████ vehicle at 7131 S. Damen Avenue, the officers approached ██████ but ██████ drove off. The officers followed ██████ vehicle to 7000 S. Winchester Avenue. ██████ exited his vehicle and Officers ██████ and ██████ confronted ██████ again and gave him verbal commands to get back into his vehicle. Officer ██████ attempted to grab ██████ arm, but ██████ pulled away in an aggressive manner clenching his fist and taking a fighting stance.

██████ denied driving a vehicle. He stated he was standing in front of the vehicle when the police stopped him. The officers told him his vehicle was stolen. ██████ stated he gave the officers his keys, title, and bill of sale along with his identification to show he was part owner of the vehicle. According to ██████ the officers took the paperwork, tasered him for no reason, and then threw him to the ground. ██████ claims he was then arrested without justification.

Officers ██████ and ██████ both stated they discharged their tasers because ██████ disregarded all verbal commands and resisted arrest by clenching his fist and taking a fighting stance. Officer ██████ stated he performed an emergency takedown on ██████ to place him in custody. Officer ██████ denied performing an emergency takedown but stated he did perform emergency handcuffing.

Officer ██████ and ██████ both completed Tactical Response Reports (TRR) documenting their use of force with ██████. According to the officers, ██████ was an active resister who “did not follow verbal direction, stiffened, fled, and pulled away.” Officer ██████ responded to ██████ by using “verbal commands, escort holds, take down/emergency handcuffing, and taser (probe discharge). Officer ██████ responded to ██████ by using “verbal commands, escort holds, armbar, take down/emergency handcuffing, and taser (probe discharge).”

██████ was arrested for driving on a revoked/suspended license³ and resisting/obstructing a police officer. He also received four citations for: no valid state registration, disobeying a stop signal, no insurance, and driving on suspended license. ██████ pled guilty to driving on a revoked/suspended license. The two counts of

resisting/obstructing a police officer and the four citations⁴ against ██████ were ██████ ██████.

III. ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSION

COPA finds that allegations against Officers ██████ and ██████ are **Not Sustained**. COPA was unable to locate any evidence, other than the involved parties’ statements, that support or refute the allegations. There is no video footage that captured the incident. ██████ denied driving the vehicle at the time of the incident and stated he was tasered and thrown to the ground without justification. Officers ██████ and ██████ both stated ██████ disregarded all verbal commands and resisted arrest by clenching his fist and taking a fighting stance. ██████ was described as an active resister who “did not follow verbal direction, stiffened, fled, and pulled away.” Additionally, no independent civilian witnesses were present. Therefore, the existing evidence does not prove or refute the allegations.


