REQUEST FOR REVIEW

On January 12, 2026, the Executive Director of the Police Board of the City of Chicago received from the Chief Administrator of the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA) a request for review of the Chief Administrator’s recommendation for discipline of Chicago police officer¹ arising out of the investigation of Complaint Register No. 2020-2663 (“Request for Review”). The Request for Review included the following material: the Final Summary Report of COPA’s investigation that sets forth the Chief Administrator’s recommendation for discipline, the Superintendent of Police’s written response to the recommendation, the Chief Administrator’s written objections to the response, and a Certificate of Meeting and Service.

The investigation stems from an incident that took place at approximately 5:11 p.m. on June 12, 2020, in the vicinity of 7148 South Green Street in Chicago. Following the conclusion of COPA’s investigation, the Chief Administrator recommended that several allegations be sustained, including discharging a firearm without justification,

and that the accused officer be discharged from the Chicago Police Department (CPD). The Superintendent did not agree with the Chief Administrator's recommendation and proposed less discipline than the Chief Administrator recommended.

According to the Certificate submitted by the Chief Administrator: (1) the Chief Administrator issued the recommendation for discipline on January 23, 2024; (2) the Chief Administrator received the Superintendent's written response on March 28, 2024; (3) the Chief Administrator's designees met with the Superintendent's designees and concluded their discussion of this matter on January 9, 2026; and (4) the Request for Review was sent via email to the Executive Director of the Police Board on January 12, 2026.

The Executive Director of the Police Board forwarded the Request for Review material to Arlette Porter, the member of the Police Board who was selected on a random basis, pursuant to Article VI of the Police Board's Rules of Procedure ("Reviewing Member"). The Reviewing Member reviewed the Request for Review pursuant to Section 2-78-130(a)(iii) of the Municipal Code of Chicago and Article VI of the Police Board's Rules of Procedure. On January 23, 2026, following her initial review of this matter, the Reviewing Member requested additional material from the investigation file as well as COPA's and CPD's positions and arguments on the issue of the effect of the five-year statute of limitations² (established in 65 ILCS 5/10-1-18.1) on

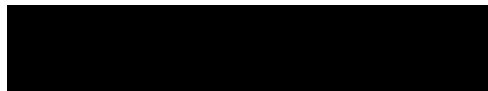
² The statute of limitations applies to the filing of charges with the Police Board and states: "If the charge is based upon an allegation of the use of unreasonable force by a police officer, the charge must be brought within 5 years after the commission of the act upon which the charge is based."

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this matter.

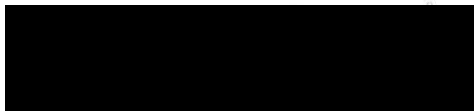
On February 4, 2026, COPA withdrew its Request for Review, stating that COPA and CPD will work together to resolve the matter consensually. Therefore, the Reviewing Member determines that there is no longer before her a disagreement between COPA and CPD to resolve.
