Summary of Incident:¹

On February 28, 2017, at approximately 1125 am, Mr. [REDACTED] attempted to enter the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) Green Line Clinton Station, located at 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago, IL 60661, when he engaged a CTA employee in a verbal argument. The CTA employee contacted the Chicago Police Department (CPD) for assistance.

At approximately 1138 am, two plain-clothed CPD officers arrived at the station. Upon arrival, the officers contacted the CTA employee, who informed the officers that Mr. [REDACTED] was blocking the handicap turnstile and refusing requests to leave the station.

The officers asked Mr. [REDACTED] to leave the station. When he refused, they placed Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs and arrested him for trespassing. A brief time later, two uniformed CPD Officers arrived and transported Mr. [REDACTED] to the 001st District Lockup.

Officers placed Mr. [REDACTED] in the rear seat of a marked CPD vehicle to transport him to the 001st District Lockup. While en route, Mr. [REDACTED] began kicking the rear door of the vehicle. Upon arrival, Mr. [REDACTED] was processed at which time the plain-clothed officers again took control of Mr. [REDACTED] and completed the booking process.

Allegations:

It is alleged that on February 28, 2017, at approximately 1138 hours, in the vicinity of 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago Illinois, 60661, that **Officer Brian Hansen #18276:**²

1. Handcuffed Mr. [REDACTED] too tightly and refused to loosen the handcuffs upon request, in violation of Rule 6; and
2. Threatened to beat Mr. [REDACTED] in violation of Rule 9.

It is alleged that on February 28, 2017, at approximately 1138 hours, in the vicinity of 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago Illinois, 60661, that **Officer Stan Matoska #5093:**

1. Intentionally slammed on the brakes of the transport CPD SUV causing Mr. [REDACTED] to strike the left side of his head against the metal divider, in violation of Rule 9; and
2. Threatened to beat Mr. [REDACTED] in violation of Rule 9.

It is alleged that on February 28, 2017, at approximately 1138 hours, in the vicinity of 001st CPD District Station, located at 1718 S. State Street, Chicago Illinois, 60616, that **Officer German Del Toro #12501:**

1. Failed to seek medical treatment for Mr. [REDACTED] despite Mr. [REDACTED]'s requests for medical treatment, in violation of Rule 6.

It is alleged that on February 28, 2017, at approximately 1138 hours, in the vicinity of 001st CPD District Station, located at 1718 S. State Street, Chicago Illinois, 60616, that **Officer Michael Jacob #5478:**

1. Failed to seek medical treatment for Mr. [REDACTED] despite Mr. McGuinn's requests for medical treatment, in violation of Rule 6.

Applicable Rules and Law:

Rule 6: Disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral.

Rule 9: Engaging in any unjustified verbal or physical altercation, while on or off duty.

General Order – G06-01-01 – IX – effective November 12, 2015.

General Order – G06-01-02 – effective January 1, 2016.

Investigation:

Testimonial Evidence

Complainant Interview

In a **statement to IRPA**³ on March 30, 2017, Mr. [REDACTED] advised, that on February 28, 2017, he was at a CTA Green Line station when he engaged in a verbal altercation with a female CTA Employee about paying his fare. After the verbal altercation ended, two CPD Officers, later identified as German Del Toro #12501 and Jacob Michael #5478, arrived and ordered Mr. [REDACTED] to leave the CTA station. Approximately fifteen minutes after being ordered to leave the CTA station, Mr. [REDACTED] was taken into custody and placed in handcuffs, that were too tight, by Officer Brain Hansen #18276. Mr. [REDACTED] informed Officer Hansen that the handcuffs were too tight but Officer Hansen did not take any action to loosen the handcuffs.

After being handcuffed, Mr. [REDACTED] was placed in a marked CPD SUV and transported to the 001st District Station. While en route to the station, Mr. [REDACTED] kicked the rear door of the CPD SUV to get the attention of Officer Hansen and Officer Stan Matoska #5093, when Officer Matoska “slammed” on the breaks of the CPD SUV causing Mr. [REDACTED] to strike the metal partition with the left side of his face. Both Officers Matoska and Hansen then threatened to beat Mr. [REDACTED] if he did not stop kicking the CPD SVU door.

Upon arrival at the 001st District Station, Mr. [REDACTED] informed Officers Jacob and Del Toro that he needed medical attention for injuries to his lower left ear and bruising to the left side of his face. Officers Jacob and Del Toro ignored Mr. [REDACTED] request. Ultimately, Mr. [REDACTED] presented for medical treatment on March 6, 2017, at Housing Forward Medical Clinic after he was released from custody. (Att. 15.)

Accused Officer Interviews

In a **statement to COPA**⁴ on November 27, 2017, **Officer Stan Matoska #5093**, advised that on February 28, 2017, he was on duty when he and his partner, Officer Brian Hansen #18276, responded to the Green Line CTA Station located at 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago IL 60661, to assist Tactical Officers,

later identified as Officers Michael Jacob #5478 and German Del Toro #12501, with transporting an arrestee, later identified as Mr. [REDACTED]

Upon arrival, Officer Matoska observed Mr. [REDACTED] near the turnstiles at the entrance to the train station. Once Mr. [REDACTED] was identified to him by Officers Jacob and Del Toro, Officer Matoska escorted him to the street level. While escorting Mr. [REDACTED], Officer Matoska observed that Mr. [REDACTED] had red eyes and a "bright red face." Additionally, Officer Matoska smelled the impurities of alcohol emitting from Mr. [REDACTED]. Based on these observations, Officer Matoska believed that Mr. [REDACTED] was intoxicated. Further, as Officer Matoska escorted Mr. [REDACTED] to the street level, Mr. [REDACTED] was complaining about being arrested. Officer Matoska does not recall if Mr. [REDACTED] complained about his handcuffs being too tight.

Once at the street level, Mr. [REDACTED] was placed in the rear of a marked CPD vehicle.⁵ After Mr. [REDACTED] was in the vehicle, Officers Matoska and Hansen drove Mr. [REDACTED] to the 001st District Lockup. Officer Matoska advised that he was driving the vehicle and estimated the travel distance to be approximately two and one half (2.5) miles, which would take between ten (10) and twenty (20) minutes to travel.

While being transported to the 001st District Lockup, Mr. [REDACTED] began to kick one of the vehicle doors⁶ and became verbally abusive.⁷ Once at 001st District Lockup, Mr. [REDACTED] was taken inside. An inspection of the CPD vehicle did not indicate that Mr. [REDACTED] kicking caused any damage.

Officer Matoska advised that he did not observe any physical injury to Mr. [REDACTED] at any time during their interaction. Additionally, Officer Matoska did not recall Mr. [REDACTED] having any complaint of injury.⁸ Furthermore, Officer Matoska does not recall Officer Hansen speaking to Mr. [REDACTED] during the transport from the CTA Station to the 001st District Lockup; in fact, Officer Matoska advised that he closed the sliding window of the partition between the front and rear seats to reduce the verbal abuse from Mr. [REDACTED] (Att. 46.)

In a **statement to COPA** on November 27, 2017, **Officer German Del Toro# 12501**, advised that on February 28, 2017, he was on duty when he and his partner, Officer Michael Jacob #5478, were dispatched to the Green Line CTA Station, located at 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago, IL 60661, in reference to a man blocking the turnstile entrances to the station.

Upon arrival, Officer Del Toro spoke to a CTA employee and learned that a male, later identified as Mr. Leo [REDACTED] was trespassing by blocking the handicap turnstile. After speaking to the CTA employee, Officer Del Toro observed Mr. [REDACTED] standing in front of the handicap entrance to the station. Officer Jacob asked Mr. [REDACTED] to leave the station, however Mr. [REDACTED] refused. In response, Officer Del Toro asked the CTA employee what she would like done. The CTA employee informed Officer Del Toro that she wanted Mr. [REDACTED] arrested.

Upon learning that the CTA employee wanted Mr. [REDACTED] arrested, Officer Jacob placed Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs, while Officer Del Toro completed his investigation. Shortly after being placed in handcuffs, Beat 174F, later identified as Officers Stan Matoska #5093 and Brian Hansen #18276, arrived and transported Mr. [REDACTED] to the 001st District Lockup. Officers Del Toro and Jacob responded to the 001st District Lockup and completed processing Mr. [REDACTED] arrest.

Officer Del Toro did not observe any indication of injury during his interaction with Mr. [REDACTED]. Additionally, Officer Del Toro did not observe any indication that Mr. [REDACTED] was intoxicated. Further, once at the 001st District Lockup, Mr. [REDACTED] never requested medical treatment from Officer Del Toro. Finally, Officer Del Toro could not recall Mr. [REDACTED] expressing any issue with his arrest or handcuffs after being placed under arrest. (Att. 57.)

In a **statement to COPA** on December 6, 2017, **Officer Michael Jacob #5478** advised, that on February 28, 2017, he was on duty when he and his partner, Officer German Del Toro #12501, were dispatched to the Green Line Clinton CTA Station, located at 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago, IL 60661, for a disturbance where a male was blocking the turnstiles.

Upon arrival, Officers Jacob and Del Toro spoke to the female CTA employee who advised that a male, later identified as Mr. [REDACTED] was blocking the handicap turnstile. After speaking to the CTA employee, Officers Jacob and Del Toro spoke to Mr. [REDACTED] and requested that he leave the station. Mr. [REDACTED] did not respond to their request. After Mr. [REDACTED] failed to respond, Officers Jacob and Del Toro asked the CTA employee if she would like Mr. [REDACTED] arrested. The CTA employee advised that she did.

Once confirming that the CTA employee wanted Mr. [REDACTED] arrested, Officers Jacob and Del Toro took him into custody. Officer Jacob could not recall who placed Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs. Once Mr. [REDACTED] was in handcuffs, Officers Jacob and Del Toro requested assistance with transporting Mr. [REDACTED] to the 001st District Lockup. Beat 174F, later identified as Officers Stan Matoska #5093 and Brian Hansen #18276, arrived and transported Mr. [REDACTED] to 001st District Lockup. Officers Jacob and Del Toro left the CTA station and drove to 001st District Lockup.⁹ Upon arrival at 001st District Lockup, Officers Jacob and Del Toro searched Mr. [REDACTED] handcuffed him to a stationary ring, and completed the arrest processing.

During all of Officer Jacob's interactions with Mr. [REDACTED] Officer Jacob did not observe any indication of injury to Mr. [REDACTED]. However, Officer Jacob did observe that Mr. [REDACTED] had the odor of alcohol impurities emitting from his person.¹⁰ Once at the 001st District Lockup, Mr. [REDACTED] never requested medical treatment. Finally, Officer Jacob did not recall Mr. [REDACTED] expressing any concerns over his arrest or the positioning of the handcuffs. (Att. 63.)

Documentary Evidence

CPD Reports

An **Initiation Report dated February 28, 2017**, from Lieutenant Stephanie Stuart, #330, details that on February 28, 2017, Mr. [REDACTED] entered the 001st District and alleged that he was verbally threatened and handcuffed too tightly. Additionally, Mr. [REDACTED] alleged that while he was being transported, the driver of the vehicle "slammed on the breaks" causing Mr. [REDACTED] to cut his car. Further, Mr. [REDACTED] alleged that he was denied medical treatment. The report does not detail any visible injuries to Mr. [REDACTED] (Att. 2.)

An Arrest Report dated February 28, 2017, for CB 19444359, details the arrest of Mr. [REDACTED] by Officers Michael Jacob, #5478 and German Del Toro #12501, on a signed complaint of trespassing at the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) train station located at 541 W. Lake Street, Chicago IL 60661. Mr. [REDACTED] was transported to 001st District Lockup. Additionally, the Arrest Report lists Officers Stan Matoska #5093 and Brain Hansen #18276 as assisting officers. Finally, the booking photograph of Mr. [REDACTED] does not depict any injuries to the left side of his face or left ear. (Att. 4, 18.)

Medical Records

Medical Treatment Records for Mr. [REDACTED] revealed, that on Monday, March 6, 2017, he presented at Housing Forward Medical Clinic with complaints of injuries to the left side of his face. Mr. [REDACTED] advised that on "Saturday,"¹¹ he was struck on the "front of his head" while "on [the] street" and his left eye was injured. The Physician's Notes detail that Mr. [REDACTED] had swelling to his right eye but there was no indication of lasting damage. Mr. [REDACTED] was prescribed ice and ibuprofen. Additionally, when answering the Mental Health History question of "[h]ave you been hit, kicked, physically hurt or sexually abused by anyone within the past year?" Mr. [REDACTED] circled yes and wrote "hit, Sunday."¹² There is no indication that Mr. [REDACTED] received additional treatment following his February 28 interaction with CPD.¹³ (Att. 22.)

CTA Surveillance Footage

Surveillance Footage from the CTA Station, located at 451 W. Lake Street, shows Mr. [REDACTED] approach the turnstiles to enter the station. Once at the turnstiles, he swipes a farecard over the reader and attempts to open the handicap gate; however, a CTA employee prevents him from entering the station. Mr. [REDACTED] engages in a conversation with two different CTA employees for several minutes, during which time he is blocking access to the handicap turnstile. Additionally, Mr. [REDACTED] is depicted speaking to passing CTA customers.

After thirty (30) minutes, two plain clothes CPD Officers, later identified as German Del Toro¹⁴ and Michael Jacob,¹⁵ arrive at the station and approach Mr. [REDACTED] and the CTA employee. The officers engage Mr. [REDACTED] and the CTA employee in conversation. After speaking to both Mr. [REDACTED] and the CTA employee, Officers Del Toro and Jacob place Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs. The footage depicts Mr. [REDACTED] standing in handcuffs. Additionally, the footage depicts Officer Del Toro speaking to the CTA employee and taking notes.

After nine (9) minutes, Officers Del Toro and Jacob escort Mr. [REDACTED] from the view of the camera. The footage does not depict Mr. [REDACTED] interacting with Officers Matoska or Hansen. (Att. 47.)

The arrest report indicates that when CPD Officers encountered Mr. [REDACTED] he had "an open wound/laceration" on the "left side of his face below the left eye from a previous unknown incident." Additionally, the report details that Mr. [REDACTED] was taken to a hospital for treatment of his injuries. The photograph of Mr. [REDACTED] taken during the booking process documents the injuries. (Att. 65.)

Analysis:

The burden of proof COPA must reach for a finding on each allegation is the preponderance of the evidence standard. During its investigation, COPA obtained CTA Surveillance Footage that conclusively showed that Officer Brian Hansen never placed Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs. Additionally, both Officers Del Toro and Jacob confirmed during their statements that they had placed Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs.

Based on the evidence, COPA determined that Officer Hansen did not place Mr. [REDACTED] in handcuffs, and therefore could not have placed the handcuffs too tightly on Mr. [REDACTED] wrists.

During its investigation, COPA learned that while Mr. [REDACTED] was transported to 001st District Lockup, based on his own admission and the statement of Officer Matoska, he kicked one of the rear doors of the CPD transport vehicle. However, COPA was unable to locate any evidence to corroborate Mr. [REDACTED] allegation that Officer Matoska “intentionally slammed” on the brakes of the transport vehicle causing Mr. [REDACTED] to strike the metal divider. Additionally, the booking photograph of Mr. [REDACTED] does not depict any injuries to his person. Further, Mr. [REDACTED] medical records detail injuries to the left side of his face and his admissions during treatment cast doubt on when the injuries occurred. Specifically, Mr. [REDACTED] informed the medical provider that he received the injuries several days after his interaction with Officers Matoska and Hansen.

Based on the evidence, COPA determined that there is insufficient evidence to support or refute Mr. [REDACTED] allegation that Officer Matoska “intentionally slammed” on the breaks of the transport vehicle causing Mr. [REDACTED] to strike the metal divider.

During its investigation, COPA was unable to locate any evidence to corroborate Mr. [REDACTED] allegation that Officers Matoska and Hansen threatened to “beat” him while he was being transported to the 001st District Lockup. COPA did learn from Officer Matoska that, while being transported, Mr. [REDACTED] was verbally aggressive, which caused Officer Matoska to close the window in the metal divider.

Based on the evidence, COPA determined that there is insufficient evidence to support or refute Mr. [REDACTED] allegations that Officers Matoska and Hansen threatened to “beat” Mr. [REDACTED] during his transport to the 001st District Lockup.

During its investigation, COPA was unable to locate any evidence to corroborate Mr. [REDACTED] allegation that Officers Del Toro and Jacob failed to seek medical treatment for Mr. [REDACTED] despite his requests. Additionally, COPA learned through the statements of Officers Del Toro and Jacob and the February 28, 2017 booking photograph that Mr. [REDACTED] did not appear to have any injuries to his person. Further, COPA learned through the statements of Officers Del Toro and Jacob that Mr. [REDACTED] did not express any need for medical treatment.

Based on the evidence, COPA determined that there is insufficient evidence to support or refute Mr. [REDACTED] allegations that Officers Del Toro and Jacob failed to seek medical treatment for Mr. [REDACTED] despite his requests.

Conclusion:

COPA recommends the finding of **Unfounded** for Allegation 1, against Officer Brian Hansen #18276, that on February 28, 2017, he placed handcuffs too tightly on Mr. [REDACTED]

COPA recommends the finding of **Not Sustained** for Allegation 2, against Officer Brian Hansen #18276, that on February 28, 2017, he threatened to beat Mr. [REDACTED]

COPA recommends the finding of **Not Sustained** for Allegations 1 and 2 against Officer Stan Matoska #5093, that on February 28, 2017, he intentionally slammed on the brakes causing Mr. [REDACTED] to strike the left side of his head against the metal divider; and threatened to beat Mr. [REDACTED]

COPA recommends the finding of **Not Sustained** for Allegation 1 made against Officer German Del Toro #12501, that on February 28, 2017, he failed to seek medical treatment for Mr. [REDACTED] despite Mr. [REDACTED] request for medical treatment.

COPA recommends the finding of **Not Sustained** for Allegation 1 made against Officer Michael Jacob #5478, that on February 28, 2017, he failed to seek medical treatment of Mr. [REDACTED] despite Mr. [REDACTED] request for medical treatment.
