#### V. INVESTIGATION<sup>3</sup>

#### a. Interviews

In a **statement** on June 20, 2015, Victim stated that he was at home on the date of the incident when unknown "girls" arrived and told him his younger brother, was being arrested for breaking into a house. When some got to the scene on behalf of their mother, because she was on house arrest. When some got to the scene, he spoke to the victim of the burglary (now known to be about arrest. Sergeant Liakopoulos repeatedly told to leave the scene and to go across the street. Continued talking to and asked for her contact information so could call her later. Sergeant Liakopoulos walked behind grabbed his arm, and tried to put the arm behind back. Thought that Sergeant Liakopoulos was trying to make him fall onto the concrete, so moved so that he fell onto grass. Sergeant Liakopoulos handcuffed Officers put into

car (now known to be Officers Zubeck and Noto) called him "black ass" and told him to "shut the fuck up" while they drove him to the 22<sup>nd</sup> District during the ride to the station. In a **statement** on June 20, 2015, Witness stated that she observed the incident from about fifty feet away on the other side of some railroad tracks. she saw a black male (now known to be talking with a white male officer (Sergeant Liakopoulos) and an unknown female. Could not hear what the people were saying. Sergeant Liakopoulos grabbed arm and put it behind his back with his right hand while he grabbed the back of neck with his left hand. Sergeant Liakopoulos then pushed the ground, got out his handcuffs, and handcuffed then left the scene. In a statement on February 4, 2016, Witness Sabrina stated that she witnessed the incident from across a set of railroad tracks. stated that she observed a black male (now known to be yelling at a male officer (Sergeant Liakopoulos). what welled and could not hear anything Sergeant Liakopoulos may have said back to Sergeant Liakopoulos put hands behind his back and handcuff him standing up against a noted that there were a lot of people outside due to the nice weather and speculated that those people would have done or said something if Sergeant Liakopoulos was doing something wrong to In a statement on 24 March 2016, Accused Sergeant Liakopoulos denied the allegations against him. He stated that he responded to a Burglary call and spoke with on the scene near a television that was identified as being taken Liakopoulos saw in the burglary. Two witnesses<sup>8</sup> waved Sergeant Liakopoulos over and identified of the neighborhood boys they had seen on the porch at house ringing the doorbell and trying the door. Sergeant Liakopoulos arrested and, about the same time, on the scene. Questioned Sergeant Liakopoulos and about what happened and about personal information. Sergeant Liakopolous told to cool off and leave alone. Sergeant Liakopoulos moved his squad car to try to give a chance to cool off. Sergeant Liakopoulos asked if she was okay and she indicated that she did not want to be left alone with was still upset and Sergeant Liakopolous repeated his request that leave the scene. Sergeant Liakopoulos stated that took a "bladed stance" and made a fist with his right hand. In response, Sergeant Liakopoulos took to the ground by wrapping his arms around waist and pushing forward. Sergeant Liakopoulos stated that he thought buttocks were the first part of his body to make contact with the ground. Sergeant Liakopoulos stated that became compliant almost immediately after he went to the ground, and helped him stand up. 
In a <b>statement</b> on December 7, 2017, Accused Police Officer James Zubeck, denied the allegations against him. Officer Zubeck stated that he had no independent recollection of the incident. Officer Zubeck denied calling a "black ass" and denied telling to "shut the fuck up." Officer Zubeck stated that Officer Noto did not use the language alleged by the complainant.
Burglary Victim  refused to provide a statement regarding this investigation but stated on the telephone on January 27, 2016, that repeatedly tried to talk to and a police officer told him to leave her alone. An officer put his hand on shoulder to bring him across the street but shrugged the officer's hand off of his shoulder. fought with officers and an officer "slammed" and handcuffed him. stated that, in her opinion, officers did not use excessive force in taking into custody.
missed several appointments to provide a statement. <sup>11</sup>
b. Physical Evidence
Medical Records from treatment at Little Company of Mary Hospital <sup>12</sup> indicate that went to the hospital on 18 June 2015. complained of pain to his left shoulder and lower back following an altercation with police. Emergency Department personnel diagnosed with a shoulder strain and a lower back strain.
c. Documentary Evidence
Arrest Reports for and was arrested for Residential Burglary and was arrested for Aggravated Assault to PO, Resist/Obstruct PO, and Walking along the Roadway. The narrative of the reports contains the same information as Sergeant Liakopoulos provided in his statement.
Sergeant Liakopoulos completed a <b>Tactical Response Report</b> <sup>16</sup> in which he described as an Assailant: Assault because he put Sergeant Liakopoulos in fear of receiving a Battery, and pulled away. Sergeant Liakopoulos responded to actions with Takedown/Emergency Handcuffing. The TRR indicates that was not injured and did not complain of injury.
VI. ANALYSIS

COPA recommends a finding of **NOT SUSTAINED** for Allegations #1 and 2 against Officer James Zubeck, that he called a "black ass" and told him to "shut the fuck up." made the allegations and Officer Zubeck denied saying it. There is insufficient available evidence to either sustain or refute these allegations.

COPA recommends a finding of **NOT SUSTAINED** for Allegations #1 and 2 against Officer Dennis Noto that he called black ass" and told him to "shut the fuck up." Officer Noto died during the pendency of this investigation and did not have an opportunity to address the allegations against him. There is insufficient available evidence to either sustain or refute these allegations.

### VII. CONCLUSION
