b. Digital Evidence
OEMC Recordings ⁶ of calls to 911 indicate he called 911 and report that his Joey Buckley, choked him and punched him. told call-takers that he whiding in bushes near his house and he would meet officers on their arrival.

In an Initiation Report ⁷ dated July 29, 2015, Sergeant Russell Marrella reported that told him that he and Officer Buckley got into a verbal altercation over damage to his vehicle. Marrella did not observe any signs of injury on face. Officer Buckley told Sergeant Marrella that the verbal altercation escalated after pushed him. Officer Buckley placed in a headlock to subdue him but was able to pull away and run off. Sergeant Marrella was unable to determine an aggressor and concluded both parties were mutual combatants. arrived on the scene and told Sergeant Marrella that Officer Buckley and had been combative in the past. Ms. told Sergeant Marrella that she did not want Officer Buckley arrested but she did want the incident documented.
A Case Report ⁸ for RD #HY359905 listed as the victim of a Domestic Battery – Simple, and Officer Buckley as a suspect. The narrative contains the same information account of the incident contained in the Initiation Report.
VI. ANALYSIS
COPA recommends a finding of NOT SUSTAINED for Allegation #1 against Field Training Officer Joey Buckley, that he placed in a headlock. made the allegation and Officer Buckley denied it in a statement to COPA. Sergeant Marrella's Initiation Report indicated that Officer Buckley reported unsuccessfully restraining using a headlock. There is insufficient available evidence to either sustain or refute this allegation.
COPA recommends a finding of NOT SUSTAINED for Allegation #2 against Field Training Officer Joey Buckley, that he punched the punched allegations. Sergeant Marrella stated that there were no signs of any injury to the sustain or refute this allegation.
