In a *Pro* Se Civil Complaint, **Sector** alleged that Sergeants Joseph Montes De Oca² and Sean Carroll,³ and Officers Antonio Ponce and Stephen Storck (collectively "the Officers") committed the various acts of misconduct detailed below while falsely arresting him.

During this investigation, the evidence COPA located detailed March 8, 2015 arrest by the accused officers. The evidence did not in any way reflect any of the other information contained in complaint.

V. INVESTIGATION⁴

a. Interviews⁵

In a statement to COPA⁶ on July 13, 2018, Accused Sergeant Sean Carroll, stated that he and his partner, Sgt. Joseph Montes De Oca, observed walking in the street. The Officers then stopped who was unable to provide any identification. The Officers took him into custody for walking in the roadway. Once in custody, a search of walking revealed cannabis. was transported to 022nd District Lockup and identified. Once he was identified, it was discovered had an active Investigative Alert for theft of a firearm. was charged with Walking Along Roadways, Possession of Cannabis, and Theft.

Sgt. Carroll denied using any force to detain and arrest Additionally, Sgt. Carroll did not observe any of the other Officers use any force to detain and arrest Sgt. Carroll explained had force been used it would have been documented in Arrest Report, the Original Case Incident Report, and a Tactical Response Report. Sgt. Carroll added that he did not independently recall his interaction with subscription but after reviewing the associated CPD reports he recalled the interaction and that he considered the interaction to be a rather ordinary occurrence. Sgt. Carroll denied all the allegations made against him.

In a statement to COPA⁷ on July 18, 2018, Accused Sergeant Joseph Montes De Oca, provided essentially the same information as Sgt. Carroll. Additionally, Sgt. Montes De Oca denied all the allegations made against him.

In a statement to COPA⁸ on June 4, 2018, Accused Officer Stephen Storck, stated that even after reviewing Arrest Report and the Original Case Incident Report, he had no recollection of ever interacting with Additionally, Storck denied all the allegations made against him. Finally, Officer Storck characterized the interaction depicted in Arrest Report as a common occurrence while working as Tactical Officer.

In a statement to COPA⁹ on June 4, 2018, Accused Officer Antonio Ponce provided essentially the same information as Officer Storck. Additionally, Officer Ponce denied all the allegations made against him.

b. Documentary Evidence

In a *Pro Se* Civil Complaint¹⁰ made the above listed allegations. The complaint did not identify which of the Officers engaged in each alleged act of misconduct. Additionally, the complaint did not provide any significant details about the alleged acts of misconduct but did allege the force used resulted in severe pain and loss of consciousness. Further, the only information in the complaint that matched CPD records was the name of the Officers and the date, time, and

general location of arrest. The civil suit was settled with the City of Chicago for \$1000 and the complaint was dismissed on December 20, 2017.

Arrest Report¹¹ and an Original Case Incident Report¹² detail that Sergeants Carroll and Montes De Oca ("the Sergeants") observed walking in the middle of the street. The Sergeants stopped and attempted issue him an ANOV for walking in the roadway; however, and did not have valid identification. The Sergeants therefore took and into custody. During a search incident to arrest the Sergeants recovered cannabis. The Sergeants learned to the 022nd District Lockup and processed. Once and was identified, the Sergeants learned that he was the subject of an active Investigative Alert for the theft of a firearm. Further, arrest report details that there were no signs of pain or injury to the was processed. Finally, booking photo does not depict any visible signs of injury.

VI. ANALYSIS

COPA recommends a finding of **Unfounded** for the allegations that the Officers unlawfully detained and arrested **Example** A peace officer may arrest a person when he has reasonable grounds to believe that the person has committed an offense.¹³

Here, Sgts. Carroll and Montes De Oca observed walking down the center of the roadway – in violation of M.C.C. 9-60-080. When failed to provide identification so that an ANOV could be issued, he was arrested. Further, the undetailed allegation of false arrest in first civil complaint combined with his unresponsiveness to requests for a statement and the stark differences between the civil complaint and CPD reports all support the inference that fallegation is more likely than not false. Based on all the available information the Officers' decision to arrest for a transport him to the 022nd District Lockup was reasonable, lawful and proper.

COPA recommends a finding of **Not Sustained** for the allegation that the Officers grabbed arm, "slammed" him in to a parked vehicle, twisted his arm, "slammed" his head into a parked vehicle, kneed him in the stomach, "threw" him into a CPD vehicle, and failed to prevent fellow officers from engaging in misconduct.

Here, the only evidence COPA located, other than **second** civil complaint, related to **second** interactions with the Officers was **second** Arrest Report and the Original Case Incident Report. Neither report detail any use for force nor injuries during **second** arrest – despite **second** allegations that his arm was twisted, and he was kneed in the stomach with such force it caused severe pain. Additionally, **second** booking photo does not depict any signs of injury – despite **second** allegation his head was "slammed" into a parked vehicle numerous times with such force he lost consciousness. The Officers denied the allegations made against them. Additionally, even after reviewing the associated reports, Officers Storck and Ponce stated that they could not even recall interacting with **second** Finally, the undetailed allegations of excessive force in **second** civil complaint combined with his unresponsiveness to requests for a statement, greatly limits COPA's


ability to understand exactly what occurred during the interaction between **second** and the Officers. Therefore, there is insufficient evidence to prove or disprove the allegations of excessive force.

VII. CONCLUSION

Based on the analysis set forth above, COPA makes the following findings:
