On April 20, 2018, at approximately 4:00 a.m., at [REDACTED] Officer Javier Celio #3769 (“Officer Celio”) was involved in a domestic battery incident with his [REDACTED] (“[REDACTED]” alleges that Officer Celio struck her about the left side of her face with an open hand. After reviewing the evidence, the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (“COPA”) brought an additional allegation against Officer Celio for being intoxicated while off duty in violation of the Chicago Police Department’s Rules and Regulations. COPA conducted a thorough investigation of the allegations and recommends they be Sustained.

V. INVESTIGATION¹

a. Interviews²

COPA conducted witness **Officer Kevin Benson's, Star #11393** ("Officer Benson"), audio statement on September 11, 2018.³ Officer Benson stated that on April 20, 2018, he was on-duty and working with Officer Dawn Richardson #12809 ("Officer Richardson"). Officer Benson stated that on April 20, 2018, he was dispatched to the residence at [REDACTED] for a domestic incident. Officer Benson stated that when he arrived at [REDACTED] he was the first unit on scene. Officer Benson stated that he and Officer Richardson went to the side of the house and knocked. Officer Benson stated he was let inside of the house by [REDACTED] ("[REDACTED]" who was screaming that Officer Celio had a gun while pointing to the top of the staircase. Officer Benson stated that was when he first observed Officer Celio exit the upstairs bedroom. Officer Benson stated he ordered Officer Celio to put his hands up. Officer Benson stated at that time he also observed one of Officer Celio's [REDACTED] holding Officer Celio's gun. Officer Benson stated he told the [REDACTED] to drop the gun. Officer Benson stated he went up to the top of the stairs and with the assistance of Officer Richardson brought Officer Celio down the stairs to conduct a further investigation. Officer Benson stated he and Officer Richardson talked to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] about what occurred prior to their arrival. Officer Benson stated that [REDACTED] told him that Officer Celio struck her about the left side of the face. Officer Benson stated [REDACTED] also told him that she and Officer Celio have problems in their marriage and Officer Celio lives in the basement of the house. Officer Benson stated [REDACTED] refused medical attention and he did not

observe any visible injuries. Officer Benson stated that he first learned Officer Celio was a police officer once Sergeant Stephan Szubski (“Sergeant Szubski”) arrived on scene. Officer Benson stated that Sergeant Szubski ordered Officer Celio out of the house. Officer Benson stated [REDACTED] was very distressed and was crying. Officer Benson stated [REDACTED] signed complaints and Officer Celio was transported to the 8th District by Officer Karl Richardt (“Officer Richardt”).

COPA conducted witness **Officer Dawn Richardson’s, Star #12809** (“Officer Richardson”), audio statement on September 11, 2018.⁴ Officer Richardson stated that on April 20, 2018, she was on duty working with Officer Benson. Officer Richardson stated that on April 20, 2018, she was dispatched to the location of [REDACTED] for a domestic battery. Officer Richardson stated that once on scene, she and Officer Benson knocked on the side door of the home. Officer Richardson stated that prior to entering the home, she heard a female screaming inside of the home. Officer Richardson stated that [REDACTED] met the officers at the door and was screaming that Officer Celio had a gun. Officer Richardson stated that she followed Officer Benson up a stairwell where Officer Celio was standing. Officer Richardson stated she radioed for more units because Officer Celio had a weapon. Officer Richardson stated that Officer Benson secured Officer Celio’s weapon after recovering it from Officer Celio’s [REDACTED]. Officer Richardson stated that Officer Celio was handcuffed, brought down the stairs, and sat at the kitchen table. Officer Richardson stated she did not know Officer Celio was a police officer until Officer Richardt arrived and made her aware. Officer Richardson stated that Officer Celio was agitated and intoxicated while in the kitchen. Officer Richardson stated that [REDACTED] informed her that Officer Celio came home intoxicated and struck her about the left side of the face with an open hand. Officer Richardson stated Sergeant Szubski ordered Officer Celio to be taken out of the home and [REDACTED] signed complainants against Officer Celio.

COPA conducted witness **Officer Karl Richardt’s, Star #19385** (“Officer Richardt”) audio statement on September 19, 2018.⁵ Officer Richardt stated that on April 20, 2018, he was on duty and responded to the location of [REDACTED] for a domestic battery. Officer Richardt stated that once he arrived on scene he was met by Sergeant Szubski who remarked that they had responded to the home last summer. Officer Richardt stated that when he was inside of the home on April 20, 2018, he observed Officer Celio in an intoxicated state. Officer Richardt stated that during the summer of 2017, he was the primary unit who responded to Officer Celio’s home. Officer Richardt stated that during the 2017 incident, Officer Celio was intoxicated but [REDACTED] only requested for Officer Celio to be relocated outside of the home. Officer Richardt stated that he could not recall whether it was in 2017 or on April 20, 2018, that Officer Celio told him that he had been arrested for domestic battery in the past.⁶

COPA conducted witness **Sergeant Stephan Szubski’s #1535** (“Sergeant Szubski”) audio statement on October 3, 2018.⁷ Sergeant Szubski stated that on April 20, 2018, he was on duty and was the supervisor who responded to the location of [REDACTED]. Sergeant Szubski stated that once he arrived he entered the home and spoke to Officers Benson and

Richardson to inform them that Officer Celio was a police officer. Sergeant Szubski stated that Officer Celio was argumentative and noncompliant. Sergeant Szubski stated that prior to escorting Officer Celio out of the home, Officer Celio complained that his handcuffs were too tight. Sergeant Szubski stated that while he attempted to loosen the handcuffs, Officer Celio was squeezing his fingers. Sergeant Szubski stated that Officer Celio stated he was intoxicated in his home. Sergeant Szubski stated that [REDACTED] signed complaints against Officer Celio. Sergeant Szubski stated that he responded to Officer's Celio's home in the summer of 2017 for a verbal domestic incident. Sergeant Szubski stated that during that incident he and the responding officers did not believe Officer Celio was intoxicated.

COPA conducted accused **Officer Javier Celio's, Star #3769** ("Officer Celio"), audio statement on October 16, 2018.⁸ Officer Celio stated that on April 20, 2018, he was and is currently married to [REDACTED] Officer Celio that he has been [REDACTED] and has [REDACTED] with her. Officer Celio stated [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] reside at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Officer Celio stated he has not resided at that location since the incident on April 20, 2018. Officer Celio that on April 20, 2018, he lived in the basement of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] while [REDACTED] and his children lived on the main floors of the house.

Officer Celio stated that prior to April 20, 2018, he saw his children when he would take them to their sporting events. Officer Celio stated he and [REDACTED] would both be present at their children's sporting events. Officer Celio stated that for the past three years, he and [REDACTED] were having problems [REDACTED], but they were attempting to reconcile. Officer Celio stated they even attempted [REDACTED] counseling about a year and a half prior to the interview. Officer Celio stated that the problems began because both he and [REDACTED] started drifting away from each other. Officer Celio stated that he began living in the basement of their home approximately one year prior to the interview. Officer Celio stated that he moved to the basement of the home because he and [REDACTED] thought it best to create physical distance between themselves while still allowing Officer Celio to be near his children. Officer Celio stated that on April 19, 2018, he was on vacation from the Chicago Police Department. Officer Celio stated that he did not recall what he did during the morning or the afternoon. Officer Celio stated that at approximately 8:30 p.m. he left his home and went to local bar, "Maggies."⁹ Officer Celio stated he walked to the bar alone and had approximately 4 to 5, 12oz draft beers. Officer Celio stated he was at the bar until 2:30 a.m. Officer Celio stated he goes to this bar approximately 3 times a month and has done so for the past two years. Officer Celio stated there are people at the bar who know him by name. Officer Celio stated that after the bar, he proceeded to go home.¹⁰ Officer Celio stated that after the bar, he walked home, and had more beers in his basement. Officer Celio stated that prior to entering the basement he retrieved his service weapon from the trunk of his vehicle. Officer Celio stated that he didn't recall how many beers he had in the basement but recalled they were 12 oz Miller Lite bottles. Officer Celio stated that while drinking in the basement, he heard a noise upstairs. Officer Celio stated that he then went upstairs. He stated that once he got upstairs he and [REDACTED] began having an argument in [REDACTED] bedroom. Officer Celio stated he recalled the door to [REDACTED] bedroom being unlocked and he entered the bedroom. Officer Celio

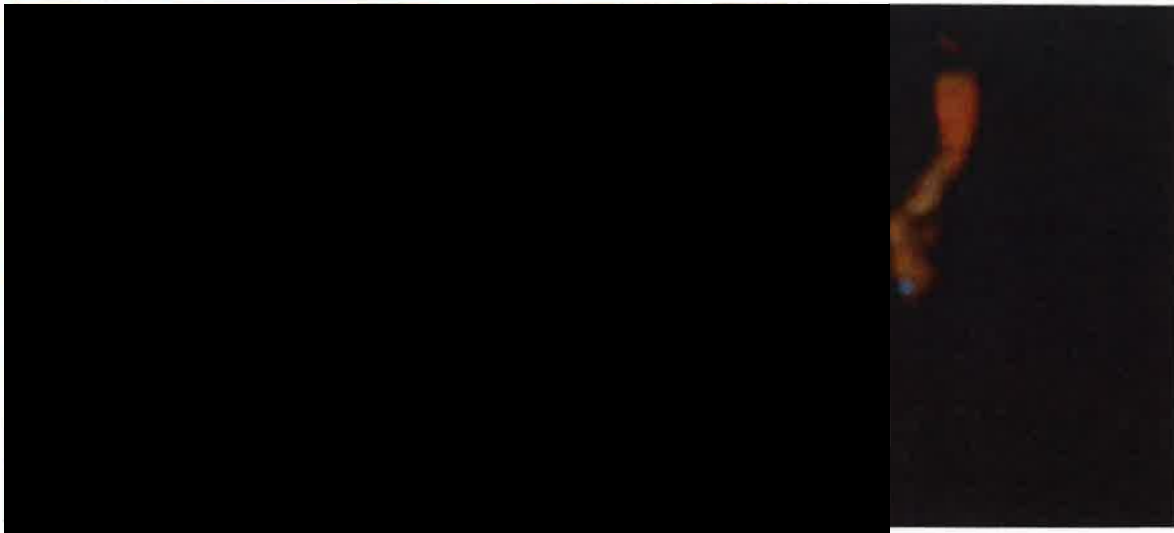

did not recall [REDACTED] ever prohibiting him from her bedroom but stated they were not sexually intimate.

Officer Celio stated he recalled the argument with [REDACTED] having to do with him drinking and going out on April 19, 2018, however, Officer Celio stated [REDACTED] was not aware he had gone out or had been drinking. Officer Celio stated that during the argument he and [REDACTED] both started to push each other. Officer Celio stated he could not explain why he and [REDACTED] started to push each other. Officer Celio stated that after the pushing, [REDACTED] began screaming for her [REDACTED]. Officer Celio stated his [REDACTED] asked him to leave the home. Officer Celio stated that he did not strike [REDACTED] about the face while in the bedroom. Officer Celio stated he did not recall what happened or what actions he took after he left [REDACTED] bedroom. Officer Celio stated he was intoxicated while in [REDACTED] bedroom. Officer Celio stated that the next thing he recalled was speaking to Sergeant Szubski. After being shown pictures of [REDACTED] face, Officer Celio stated he observed redness to the left side of [REDACTED] face. Officer Celio stated he did not know how [REDACTED] obtained the redness to the left side of her face. Officer Celio stated that in Officer Benson's BWC, he did hear [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] state that he hit [REDACTED] on the left side of her face. Officer Celio stated he did not know how [REDACTED] sustained the redness to her face. Officer Celio stated he did not know why [REDACTED] claimed he hit her. Officer Celio stated that he and [REDACTED] have had arguments in the past when he's returned home intoxicated.¹¹ Officer Celio stated that while he did not recall the number of times, the police have responded to his home for similar incidents. Officer Celio stated that after the incident on April 20, 2018, he has attended Alcoholics Anonymous classes and as of October 16, 2018, he was sober for 179 days. Officer Celio further stated that he and [REDACTED] are separated and not living together.

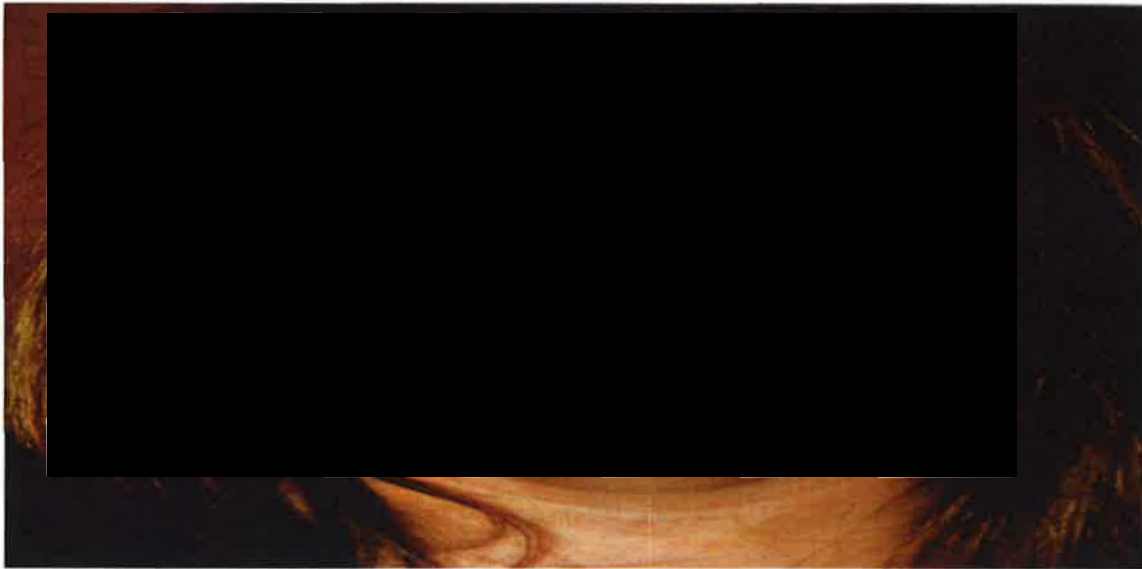
b. Digital Evidence

Photographs taken by the Chicago Police Department's Evidence Technician on April 20, 2018, depict redness to the left side of [REDACTED] face.¹²

Officer Richardson's **Body Worn Camera ("BWC")** footage captures Officers Benson and Richardson entering the home of Officer Celio. Officer Benson knocks on the door and is met by [REDACTED] screaming, "he has a gun, he has a gun, he has a gun."¹³ Officers Richardson and Benson enter the home and see Officer Celio at the top of a stair case. Officers Richardson and Benson handcuff Officer Celio and sit him down in the kitchen. Officer Richardson calls for more units and Officer Benson secures Officer Celio's weapon. Officers Benson and Richardson proceed to ask [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] what happened prior to them arriving. [REDACTED] explains that Officer Celio came home intoxicated and hit [REDACTED] further states that she and [REDACTED] pushed Officer Celio out of the home. [REDACTED] states Officer Celio left and returned with his weapon. [REDACTED] states she struggled with Officer Celio to retrieve the weapon. [REDACTED] states Officer Celio is frequently intoxicated. [REDACTED] states Officer Celio hit her with an open hand on the left side of her face. Responding officers arrive on scene including Sergeant Szubski and Officer Richardt who state they had responded to the residence previously for a similar event. Officer Celio is seen mumbling.

Sergeant Szubski orders Officer Celio to be taken out of the home. Before Officer Celio is taken out of the home, Sergeant Szubski attempts to check the handcuffs on Officer Celio, however, Officer Celio grabs Sergeant Szubski's hands. After Officer Celio is removed from the home, Sergeant Szubski asks [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] about what happened. [REDACTED] states that Officer Celio came home, forced opened the door to her bedroom, and hit her in the face. [REDACTED] states that her two [REDACTED] woke up and held Officer Celio back from continuing to hit her. [REDACTED] states [REDACTED] was able to get Officer Celio out of the home. [REDACTED] states Officer Celio left the home but returned shortly and he attempted to open her bedroom door again. [REDACTED] states she was fearful and she called for her [REDACTED] [REDACTED] states that when she saw Officer Celio the second time, her [REDACTED] was struggling with him to retrieve the gun. [REDACTED] states she also struggled with Officer Celio until she was able to retrieve the gun. [REDACTED] states that Officer

Celio lives in the basement and does not live with her and her [REDACTED] in the main home. [REDACTED] further added that Officer Celio does not normally come up to the main house unless he has something scheduled with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] states Officer Celio has a drinking problem and encouraged [REDACTED] to sign complaints against Officer Celio because he has put them through enough. [REDACTED] states that Officer Celio has committed similar acts in the past and will continue to do them because he continues to get away with it. [REDACTED] signed complaints against Officer Celio.¹⁴

Officer Richardt's BWC footage captures Officer Richardt arriving at [REDACTED] [REDACTED]¹⁵ Sergeant Szubski is heard telling Officer Richardt that they have been there in the past. Officer Richardt states he was at the residence last summer after a golf outing. Once Officer Richardt entered the home he is heard stating, "oh man, again with him,"¹⁶ Officer Richardt remains inside of the home until Officer Celio is removed. Once outside Officer Richardt loosens Officer Celio's handcuffs and tells him that he is making bad decisions and advises him not to make any more comments. Officer Richardt walks Officer Celio to his vehicle to sit him inside. Officer Richardt pleads with Officer Celio to sit in the vehicle so that his neighbors don't see him in his intoxicated state. Officer Celio refuses to enter the vehicle. After 16 minutes of struggling with the officers, the officers convince Officer Celio to enter the vehicle.

Sergeant Szubski's BWC footage begins capturing when Officer Celio is handcuffed in the kitchen.¹⁷ Sergeant Szubski's BWC captures the same footage of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] recanting the incident as described in Officer Richardson's BWC. Sergeant Szubski's BWC also captures the assisting officers struggling to place Officer Celio into the police vehicle as described in Officer Richardt's BWC.

Audio of 911 EV#01838 taken on April 20, 2018, at 4:10 a.m. captures [REDACTED] stating that her [REDACTED] hit her in the face. [REDACTED] states that Officer Celio started fighting with her [REDACTED] [REDACTED] gives the 911 operator her address and adds that Officer Celio is drunk.¹⁸

Audio of 911 EV#01898 taken on April 20, 2018, at 4:24 a.m. captures [REDACTED] stating that Officer Celio is again at her home and pleads for the police to hurry up.¹⁹

CPD Radio Transmission Z6 0400-0500 captures dispatch stating that [REDACTED] is having a dispute with her [REDACTED] and requests units to respond to [REDACTED].²⁰

The **Initiation Report** submitted by Sergeant Szubski on April 20, 2018, indicates that upon arrival he observed Officer Celio handcuffed and seated in the kitchen. Sergeant Szubski indicates in the report that [REDACTED] alleged that Officer Celio struck her about the left side of her face with an open hand. The report further states that Officer Celio stated he was intoxicated in his home. It states that Officer Celio wanted help and requested the number to the Employee Assistance Program (“EAP”).

The **Relief of Police Powers Report** submitted by Sergeant Marco Tirado on April 20, 2018, indicates that after being notified of a domestic battery arrest of off duty Officer Celio, he went to the 8th District where Officer Celio was being processed.²¹ Sergeant Tirado indicated that upon arrival at approximately 8:05 a.m., he was informed that there was a self-made allegation of off duty intoxication by Officer Celio. The report states that he immediately informed his command. It further states that while Officer Celio was being processed, he requested the initiation report and related To-From-Subject reports from all involved officers. Sergeant Tirado indicates in the report that he informed Celio that the criminal investigation had terminated, of his specific charges/allegations, and of his administrative proceeding rights. Sergeant Tirado indicates in the report that after a 20-minute observation period, he conducted a blood alcohol content (“BAC”) TEST on Officer Celio with a result of .132 g/100mL at approximately 9:59 a.m. Sergeant Tirado further indicated that he advised Officer Celio to surrender his Chicago Police Department star, shield, and identification card upon reporting to the Offices of the Bureau of Internal Affairs on April 23, 2018 for reassignment.

To-From-Subject Report, written by Officer Benson indicates that he believed officer Celio was intoxicated because Officer Celio related that he was intoxicated in his own home.²²

To-From-Subject Report, written by Officer Richardson indicates that she believed Officer Celio was intoxicated because Officer Celio related that he was intoxicated in his own home.²³

Original Case Incident Report RD# [REDACTED] indicates responding officers responded to a dispatched call at [REDACTED] for a domestic battery.²⁴ Upon arrival, responding officers entered the residence and were met by [REDACTED] who related that Officer Celio had struck her about the left side of her face with an open hand. [REDACTED] further indicated that Officer Celio had a weapon and she did not wish for the weapon to remain in the residence. [REDACTED] refused medical attention and an evidence technician was called on scene to photograph her face at 6:57 a.m. [REDACTED] signed complaints against Officer Celio.

Arrest Report 19632078 indicates that Officer Celio was charged with a Class A misdemeanor domestic battery²⁵ after ██████ related that he struck her about the left side of the face with an open hand.²⁶

VI. ANALYSIS

The burden of proof COPA uses in its analysis is the preponderance of the evidence standard. It is alleged by ██████ that Officer Celio struck her about the face. Through the course of the investigation, additional evidence of misconduct was discovered. Therefore, COPA further alleges that Officer Celio was intoxicated while off duty. After analyzing the evidence, COPA determined the allegations were supported by sufficient evidence to justify a recommendation of sustained for both allegations.

Evidence shows that Officer Celio and ██████ have had ██████ problems for the past three years. Despite attempts to try to repair their ██████ Officer Celio and ██████ decided to create physical distance while maintaining a ██████ presence by having Officer Celio relocate from the main home to the basement. While Officer Celio did not admit to striking ██████ and having a drinking habit, the statements from ██████ Officer Richardt, and Sergeant Szubski indicate that Officer Celio has a history of domestic altercations and off duty intoxication.

On April 19, 2018, Officer Celio became intoxicated after consuming several beers between the hours of 8:30 p.m. and 3:00 a.m. on April 20, 2018. Notwithstanding the basement living arrangements, COPA makes a finding of fact that Officer Celio forcefully entered ██████ bedroom sometime after 3:00 a.m., alleging he heard a noise in her bedroom. While Officer Celio claimed ██████ did not previously prohibit him from entering her bedroom, the couple's three-year long ██████ issues and one year long separate living arrangement, indicate that Officer Celio was not welcome in ██████ bedroom. Officer Celio further indicated that he and ██████ had a verbal altercation that became mutually physical. Officer Celio, however, was adamant about not having struck ██████ about the face. Officer Celio admitted that he while he recalled being in ██████ bedroom intoxicated, he had no recollection of what occurred up until his interaction with Sergeant Szubski.

In weighing the credibility of Officer Celio and ██████ it is more likely than not that the incident occurred as reported by ██████ made an immediate 911 phone call at 4:10 a.m. requesting that the police respond to her residence. She stated that her ██████ was drunk and hit her in the face. ██████ indicated that she and ██████ were able to push Officer Celio out of the home after that initial altercation. At 4:24 a.m., ██████ made a second 911 phone call stating that Officer Celio was again at her home and requested for the police to hurry up. It is reasonable to infer that during the time Officer Celio pushed ██████ he also struck her about the left side of the face and that due to Officer Celio's level of intoxication, is it plausible that he

does not recall his actions with accuracy. For the aforementioned reasons and in the hope of Officer Celio’s continual self-improvement, COPA recommends the finding of Sustained with respect to Allegation #1.

The allegation that Officer Celio was intoxicated off-duty is substantiated by his own admission and the subsequent BAC of .132 g/100mL as indicated in his blow approximately 5 hours after the incident involving [REDACTED]. Based on the available evidence, COPA recommends that Allegation #2 be sustained.

VII. RECOMMENDED DISCIPLINE FOR SUSTAINED ALLEGATIONS

a. Officer Javier Celio

i. Complimentary and Disciplinary History

Officer Celio’s complimentary history reflects that he has received the Democratic National Convention Award, Presidential Election Deployment Award 2008, 2004 Crime Reduction Ribbon, Nato Summit Service Award, Joint Operations Award, and 2009 Crime Reduction Award once. Officer Celio has received the Problem-Solving Award and Attendance Recognition Award four times. Officer Celio has received the Emblem of Recognition – Physical Fitness three times, Department Commendation 20 times, Honorable mentions 115 times. Officer Celio has received five complimentary letters and two other awards.

Officer Celio’s disciplinary history reflects that he received two days off for a preventable accident that occurred on February 21, 2018.

Based on the analysis set forth above, COPA makes the following findings:
