

V. INVESTIGATION²

a. Interviews

In the meantime, they called an ambulance to the scene for because Officer Bakopoulos had touched her and she was all shaken up. When Sergeant Vanderploeg arrived, he spoke with and her family, and then spoke with family and friends. Sergeant Vanderploeg then told that there were conflicting stories and he could not do anything. Officer Bakopoulos did not want or back in his house, and Sergeant Vanderploeg could not do anything about that. told Sergeant Vanderploeg she wanted to press charges. 

Sergeant Vanderploeg then went to the back yard and spoke with Officer Bakopoulos. Officer Bakopoulos stated there had been an argument and began screaming at Officer Bakopoulos and poking him in the chest. Officer Bakopoulos told to leave the home multiple times, but she did not comply. Officer Bakopoulos grabbed by the arm and escorted her out of the house. Sergeant Vanderploeg also spoke with three or four other individuals who were present, who stated they saw walk out of the home and that she was not pushed. Sergeant Vanderploeg did not arrest any of the parties because he was unable to determine exactly what had transpired. The situation was very stressful and all parties were agitated. There were two different sides to the story. A police report was completed to document the incident, but Sergeant Vanderploeg did not feel that an arrest was warranted given the totality of the circumstances. When asked why Officer Bakopoulos was listed as the victim on the police report was listed as the suspect, Sergeant Vanderploeg responded, "Due to what we could gather, she pushed the homeowner in the house and that's when he escorted her out of the house. And that's why."¹³ **COPA interviewed witness Officer Cortes**¹⁴ on December 4, 2018. During the interview, Officer Cortes stated that June 12, 2018 was his first day on duty as a Chicago Police Officer. Officer Cortes was partnered with his Field Training Officer, Officer Aguilera. They responded to a call for domestic disturbance. When they arrived at the residence, Officer Bakopoulos and were standing in the driveway and and were on the sidewalk. Officer Cortes first spoke with and who related that they had been inside Officer Bakopoulos' residence visiting with dying husband and Officer Bakopoulos had kicked them out. Upon learning that the incident involved an off-duty police officer, Officer Aguilera immediately requested a sergeant to the scene. Indicated that she was shaking, so Officer Cortes also requested an ambulance to the scene. Officer Aguilera and Sergeant Vanderploeg spoke with Officer Bakopoulos, who indicated had gotten very close to him and was pointing her finger in his face and pushing his chest. There were other people present, but Officer Cortes did not speak with anyone who saw any physical interaction between Officer Bakopoulos and The hospice nurse related that he had heard an argument but did not see anything. Officer Cortes was unable to determine who was the primary aggressor in this situation. Ultimately Sergeant Vanderploeg decided that no arrests would be made because there was no evidence to corroborate either side of the story. Officer Cortes drafted a police report for the incident. In the report, Officer Cortes listed Officer Bakopoulos as the victim and

COPA interviewed accused Officer Bakopoulos ¹⁵ on April 11, 2019. During the interview, Officer Bakopoulos stated that on June 12, 2018 he was at his home and he had company over because his good friend and brother-in-law, was on hospice at his home. had been living with Officer Bakopoulos on and off since December 2017. wife, stayed with at the Bakopoulos residence "once in a while." Officer Bakopoulos did not like at all, although he respected decision to be with her. Officer Bakopoulos had been friends with for twenty-six years and had been married to sister, for four years.
On June 12, 2018, was in and out of consciousness. If ather had asked several times for some of personal belongings because he had the financial power of attorney. It refused to turn over the items, so father had Officer Bakopoulos ask for the items. While inside the kitchen, Officer Bakopoulos began yelling at telling her that if she is going to lie to him she can leave his house. At this point, came running up and began yelling at Officer Bakopoulos, telling him not to talk to her daughter in that manner. Pushed past him and began hitting him in the chest. Officer Bakopoulos had his hands up because he did not want to have a physical confrontation with continued to shove him. Officer Bakopoulos told to get out of his house. Continued to push Officer Bakopoulos in the chest, so Officer Bakopoulos grabbed her by her left wrist and bicep, and he "escorted" her out the door, through the mudroom, and onto the porch. When asked to describe this interaction, Officer Bakopoulos stated that did not leave voluntarily, but he also did not force her out of the house. When asked to reconcile these two seemingly conflicting statements, Officer Bakopoulos stated that he did not use force in that he did not hurt in any way or throw her out; he merely walked her out of his house.
Once outside of the house, screamed at threatening to slap her. At some point also exited the house. Officer Bakopoulos did not recall either asking to retrieve their belongings from inside the house.
Two officers and a sergeant arrived and took a statement from those who were present. An ambulance arrived for but Officer Bakopoulos stated this was just "to make a scene." ¹⁷
brother, arrived after the altercation. Both Eli and threatened Officer Bakopoulos, stating that they were going to "fuck with" his job and get him fired. Officer Bakopoulos did not recall if any responding officers were present when these threats were made.
Later that evening, Officer Bakopoulos texted telling her to come back, but she did not respond.
b. Digital Evidence

Officer Aguilera and Sergeant Vanderploeg were both equipped with body-worn cameras¹⁹. However, because they arrived after the incident occurred, the footage does not capture any interaction between Officer Bakopoulos and

c. Physical Evidence

A Chicago Fire Department Ambulance Report²⁰ for states that she was found in the care of CPD and she had been pushed by a family member. "continued to be verbally harassed by family member and was pushed more." stated that she was not injured but wanted her heart rate and blood pressure checked. The report indicates that refused transport to the hospital and was left in the care of CPD and other family members not involved in the altercation.

d. Documentary Evidence

An Original Case Incident Report²² lists Officer Bakopoulos as the Victim and as the Suspect. The narrative states that officers responded to a "very high stress situation involving a very ill person who is on hospice ... and could potentially decease at any time". Officer Bakopoulos stated that he had a verbal altercation with and "she got very close to victim, was pointing her finger at his face, and pushed victim on his chest. At that point in time, victim stated that he grabbed offender's arm and escorted offender out of his residence." Officers then spoke with who stated that she was shaking. Officers requested an ambulance to the scene, and was ultimately cleared by the paramedics. It told officers that Officer Bakopoulos pushed A hospice nurse was present during the altercation, but he stated he only heard an argument and did not see anything. Officers were "unable to determine what exactly occurred at the time of the argument."

A Case Supplementary Report²³ documents subsequent investigation by Detective Rodriguez in which she spoke with Officer Bakopoulos. According to the report, Officer Bakopoulos stated that his brother-in-law was in hospice in his residence on June 12, 2018.

This brother-in-law's wife's mother, was visiting his residence and had interfered with civil matters concerning his brother-in-law. During a verbal altercation,

COPA spoke with the hospice nurse, growth the hospice nurse, growth the call in an **Investigative Report**²⁴. During the conversation, growth stated he was providing hospice care for a patient at growth on June 12, 2018. Stated that this was the only time he provided care to this patient and he was unaware of any discord among the patient's family members. Stated that he did not see any altercation or hear any yelling because he was on the opposite side of the house in the living room. Stated there were a "bunch" of people there and all of a sudden everyone went outside to the back of the house. At this point, growth became uncomfortable remaining in the house. He called his supervisor and left.

VI. LEGAL STANDARD

For each Allegation COPA must make one of the following findings:

- 1. <u>Sustained</u> where it is determined the allegation is supported by a preponderance of the evidence;
- 2. <u>Not Sustained</u> where it is determined there is insufficient evidence to prove the allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- 3. <u>Unfounded</u> where it is determined by clear and convincing evidence that an allegation is false or not factual; or
- 4. <u>Exonerated</u> where it is determined by clear and convincing evidence that the conduct descried in the allegation occurred, but it is lawful and proper.

A **preponderance of evidence** can be described as evidence indicating that it is **more likely than not** that the conduct reviewed complied with Department policy. *See Avery v. State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Co.*, 216 III. 2d 100, 191 (2005), (a proposition is proven by a preponderance of the evidence when it has found to be more probably true than not). If the evidence gathered in an investigation establishes that it is more likely that the conduct complied with Department policy than that it did not, even if by a narrow margin, then the preponderance of the evidence standard is met.

Clear and convincing evidence is a higher standard than a preponderance of the evidence but lower than the "beyond-a-reasonable doubt" standard required to convict a person of a criminal offense. See *e.g.*, *People v. Coan*, 2016 IL App (2d) 151036 (2016). Clear and Convincing can be defined as a "degree of proof, which, considering all the evidence in the case, produces the firm and abiding belief that it is highly probable that the proposition . . . is true." *Id.* at ¶ 28.

VII. ANALYSIS

alleges that Officer Bakopoulos grabbed her by the arm and pushed her out of his house. Officer Bakopoulos, on the other hand, alleges that was the primary aggressor, pushing him and poking him in the chest. Officer Bakopoulos admits to grabbing by the arm, but states it was only after she physically attacked him. Moreover, Officer Bakopoulos insists he did not use any force when grabbing arm; he merely walked her out of his house when she refused his verbal orders to leave. Officer Bakopoulos denies pushing at any time.
Witnesses and corroborated part of Officer Bakopoulos' account, stating they saw him holding by the arm as he escorted her out of the residence, but they did not see him push her. on the other hand, stated that she saw Officer Bakopoulos "shove"
Due to conflicting witness statements and a lack of independent evidence, COPA is unable to determine by clear and convincing evidence whether Officer Bakopoulos pushed Accordingly, the allegation that Officer Bakopoulos pushed is Not Sustained .
None of the witnesses COPA interviewed were inside at the time Officer Bakopoulos alleges pushed and poked him. As such, this part of Officer Bakopoulos' account is not corroborated.
The fact that Officer Bakopoulos grabbed by the arm is not in dispute. However, Officer Bakopoulos insists that this occurred as a result of using physical force against him and refusing his verbal orders to leave his residence. Since there exists no corroborating evidence that physically attacked Officer Bakopoulos, COPA is unable to determine by clear and convincing evidence if Officer Bakopoulos' actions were justified. Therefore, the allegation that Officer Bakopoulos grabbed by the arm without justification is Not Sustained .

VIII. CONCLUSION

Based on the analysis set forth above, COPA makes the following findings:
