V. INVESTIGATION ²

a. Interviews


On June 16, 2017 IPRA conducted an interview of Officer COPA offices located at 1615 West Chicago Avenue, Chicago, IL. Cope It. Cope It. Peabody but filed for Cope It. Cope I

| she then attempted to pick up the younger child to take her to bed, but as she reached for their youngest Lt. Peabody held her hand to prevent her from picking up the children. pulled back and attempted to pick up her again, but Lt. Peabody twisted her wrist backward and inward in a control mechanism utilized by police officers. stated she was able to break her hand away and attempted to pick up her again. stated that Lt. Peabody, still lying in the bed, kicked her one time about the right side of her stomach. |

| then went downstairs, called her and told her what happened. Her informed her that she and her boyfriend, were on their way. Mr. arrived first, and upon his arrival, went upstairs again to grab the children and go to her house. Istated that when she went upstairs and attempted to grab the children, Lt. Peabody grabbed her wrist and locked it again, so she pulled back. As she attempted to grab the children another time, Lt. Peabody started screaming at Mr. leave the house and began insulting them. watch the iPad to calm them down. attempted to calm Lt. Peabody down and to get him to leave the home, but he refused. stated that they called Lt. Peabody's and asked them to come over but his did not arrive until everything was resolved. Eventually, Lt. Ms. related that the second incident she was informed of occurred on May 24, 2017. told her that on that date, Lt. Peabody tried to push her out of a bedroom and slammed the door on arm. Ms. did not witness either of these incidents but was informed of them during phone conversations with |

| Ms. related that on May 26, 2017, and text Lt. Peabody's Eventually, she arrived at the Peabody residence and heard Lt. Peabody yelling. Ms. stated she went upstairs and observed everyone standing outside of the children's bedrooms. Ms. explained that she arrived after the physical altercation was over. Ms. described Lt. Peabody as enraged and irrational. Ms. related that Lt. Peabody then called Ms. and Mr. names like "fucking assholes" and told them to stay away from his family. Ms. stated that Lt. Peabody, while holding the youngest child, walked over to the iPad and smashed it using his fist, causing it to crack. Lt. Peabody's who arrived earlier, took the youngest child from him and attempted to calm him down. | On December 5, 2017 COPA conducted an interview of Lieutenant Robert Peabody ¹⁵ at the COPA offices located at 1615 West Chicago Avenue, Chicago, IL. Lt. Peabody related that prior to the date of this incident, was verbally abusive to him by calling him a "fat piece of shit" and telling him that he should kill himself. Lt. Peabody described his relationship with leading up to the as strained due to the pending proceedings, verbal abuse from and disagreements regarding parenting issues. Lt. Peabody stated his relationship with Ms. was positive for a long time, but ultimately, she was not supportive of him and took his side in their arguments. |

| With respect to May 26, 2017, Lt. Peabody stated he was laying in bed with their two children watching a show on their iPad, when |
| Lt. Peabody stated that he then talked to the children, calmed them down and got them to sleep. Approximately twenty minutes later entered the room again. Lt. Peabody related that as he stood up to leave the room, they were standing close to each other and their bodies brushed against each other. He denied twisting her wrist a second time, grabbing her about the body, pushing her or dragging her into the hallway. Lt. Peabody related that they were in the bedroom and was yelling, when Mr. came up the stairs and into the room. He further stated that Mr. approached him from behind, grabbed him by the left shoulder or arm and started pulling him backwards. After this, Mr. and went downstairs. Lt. Peabody remained upstairs to calm the girls down. |
| Eventually, he heard his voice downstairs and went downstairs while holding Lt. Peabody denied telling to "get the fuck out," calling Ms. or Mr. "fucking assholes," or yelling and screaming. He further stated that he was never bitten. Lt. Peabody stated that while he was downstairs a discussion took place about him leaving the home, but he refused to do so. His was holding so eventually he took and went upstairs to bed. He denied breaking the iPad with his fist, stating that they own two of them and they both have broken screens from the children. |
| When asked about his To/From Report wherein he claimed made threats to him and his career, Lt. Peabody recalled specific threats by Specifically, that on May 2, 2017 she stated, "You're fucked, this is Cook County. You're going to lose your spot |

at work. I'm going downtown today, you'll probably get stripped." Additionally he stated that on May 3, 2017 she stated, "I won't go before a judge if you agree to move out today, in writing." Lt. Peabody claimed that on approximately three occasions she made threats to his career.

With respect to the allegations about the May 24, 2017 incident, Lt. Peabody stated he did not recall anything specific about that date and denied all the allegations. However, he did recall an incident involving a door that he claimed occurred after this complaint was filed. He stated he believed that occurred in September. On that date, he stated he was getting ready in the bedroom and rushed towards the door and banged herself into it claiming he hit her with the door. Lt. Peabody denied all allegations relating to the May 24, 2017 incident.

With respect to the allegations regarding the May 1, 2017 incident, Lt. Peabody stated he was lying in bed with the children, when came home and became upset that the children were awake. Climbed towards the bed and took the iPad away. She then proceeded to climb on top of him and began yelling. Lt. Peabody denied twisting her wrist pressing her against the footboard with his foot, using pressure against her upper thigh with his foot, or having any physical contact with her.

b. Digital Evidence

Photos of Officer were taken on May 27, 2017 by Chicago Police Department Evidence Technicians. Photos were taken on face, arm and stomach. No injuries are visible.

Photos of Lt. Robert Peabody²¹ were taken on May 30, 2017 by Chicago Police Department Evidence Technicians. Photos were taken on Lt. Peabody's face and hands. Lt. Peabody's left hand appears to have minor abrasions on the top knuckles of this index and middle finger.

c. Documentary Evidence

The **Original Case Incident Report**²² (JA281079) and **Initiation Report**²³ document that went to the 16th District on May 27, 2017 at approximately 9:40 a.m. to document an incident that occurred the night before on May 26, 2017 at approximately 10:00 p.m. related that during a verbal dispute, Lt. Peabody, her grabbed her wrist and bent it back, kicked her in the stomach, grabbed her and held her from behind. related that she bit Lt. Peabody's hand in attempts to free herself from his grasp. The report notes that their two children and were witnesses and Mr. pulled Lt. Peabody off did not relate any injuries from the incident but noted that there

were previous altercations with Lt. Peabody on May 1st and May 24th, 2017. The Initiation Report notes that police were not called to the scene to maintain privacy.

In a **To-From Report dated May 27, 2017**, ²⁴ Lt. Peabody stated that over the past several months, his had made several references about ruining his career as well as personal and professional reputation. Lt. Peabody stated he believed she intended to take actions, including false allegations, to impact him negatively.

In a **To-From Report dated May 30, 2017**,²⁵ Lt. Peabody stated he was threatened on May 26, 2017 and May 27, 2017 by his with unwarranted allegations. Lt. Peabody states he completed a To-From report on May 27, 2017 to alert the department of the possibility of these allegations due to the threats and a pending mediation regarding child custody. Lt. Peabody states through his attorney, he filed a motion to refer parties to mediation on May 25, 2017. Lt. Peabody states on May 30, 2017, he searched and confirmed that case report for domestic battery had been completed on May 27, 2017.

On June 19, 2017, COPA received an email from witness containing **two** screenshots of text message conversations. One conversation was between Ms. Lt. Peabody that shows Ms. asking Lieutenant Peabody not to contact her unless it was about her grandchildren. Lt. Peabody responds by telling her not to take laundry out of their home or he would file a theft report. The second text message conversation is between Ms. and and dated May 26th at 11:05 p.m. In this message, Ms. tells Ms. and I [are] at and Bobs. He hit her again and she is going to have him arrested. Can someone come here and try to get him to leave. He's very irrational." Ms. responds that she is on her way.

VI. LEGAL STANDARD

For each Allegation COPA must make one of the following findings:

- 1. <u>Sustained</u> where it is determined the allegation is supported by a preponderance of the evidence;
- 2. <u>Not Sustained</u> where it is determined there is insufficient evidence to prove the allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- 3. <u>Unfounded</u> where it is determined by clear and convincing evidence that an allegation is false or not factual; or

4. <u>Exonerated</u> - where it is determined by clear and convincing evidence that the conduct described in the allegation occurred, but it is lawful and proper.

A **preponderance of evidence** can be described as evidence indicating that it is **more likely than not** that the conduct occurred and violated Department policy. *See Avery v. State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Co.*, 216 Ill. 2d 100, 191 (2005), (a proposition is proved by a preponderance of the evidence when it has found to be more probably true than not). If the evidence gathered in an investigation establishes that it is more likely that the misconduct occurred, even if by a narrow margin, then the preponderance of the evidence standard is met.

Clear and convincing evidence is a higher standard than a preponderance of the evidence but lower than the "beyond-a-reasonable doubt" standard required to convict a person of a criminal offense. See *e.g.*, *People v. Coan*, 2016 IL App (2d) 151036 (2016). Clear and Convincing can be defined as a "degree of proof, which, considering all the evidence in the case, produces the firm and abiding belief that it is highly probable that the proposition . . . is true." *Id.* at \P 28.

VII. ANALYSIS

COPA finds that **Allegations 1 through 10** that on May 26, 2017 Lt. Peabody engaged in and initiated an unjustified physical altercation with twisted her wrist as she attempted to pick up their child, kicked her once in the stomach, twisted her wrist a second time, grabbed her around the body and dragged her out of the bedroom, verbally abused her by stating "Get the fuck out," verbally abused Mr. by stating "Fucking assholes, and purposely damaged an iPad by striking it with his fist are all **Sustained**. that on this date she attempted to reach for her younger to take her to bed and Lt. Peabody held her hand to prevent her from doing so and twisted her wrist backward and inward in a control mechanism utilized by police officers. When she tried to pick up her a second time, Lt. Peabody kicked her in the stomach. She then called Ms. for help, who in turn called Mr. went upstairs and tried to get the children When Mr. arrived, again. However, Lt. Peabody grabbed her wrist and locked it. When she tried again to get the children, he grabbed her about the body in a body lock and dragged her down the hall while yelling, stated she bit Lt. Peabody on his right hand near the knuckles "Get the fuck out." to get him off her and believed she broke the skin. This physical altercation was only stopped when Mr. came upstairs and pulled Lt. Peabody off her. Mr. corroborated account in part stating he heard her yelling, "You're hurting me! You're hurting me!" and proceeded upstairs, where he observed Lt. Peabody bent over her and on top of her. He then threw Lt. Peabody into the wall to get him off Ms. then arrived on scene. related that Lt. Peabody called them "fucking assholes," which Both Ms. and Mr. corroborated, stating that Lt. Peabody was screaming at them and insulting them. also related that at one point, Lt. Peabody took the children's iPad and and Ms. smashed it with his fist while holding their younger child.

Although Ms. denied observing Lt. Peabody involved in the physical altercation or verbally abusing Mr. and Ms. denied it is clear from all accounts that she was the last to arrive on scene. None of the parties relate that she was present during the physical altercation or when Lt. Peabody was verbally abusive. The only incident that the witnesses state Ms.

| was present for was when he purposely damaged the iPad by striking it with his fist. Ms. denies observing this, but admits she saw him put his hand on the counter. COPA finds that it is likely that Ms. is minimizing his conduct. It seems unusual that she would remember him placing his hand on the counter unless something additional made this movement significant. As his she may be minimizing the action to protect him. Even if it is true that Ms. did not observe him damage the iPad, two other witnesses did observe this conduct. Lt. Peabody denies the allegations in their entirety and stated he was not bit on his hand. It should be noted that ET photos reveal minor abrasions to his left hand, though stated she bit his right hand. COPA does not find his account credible given the other witness accounts. Therefore, based on the preponderance of the evidence, COPA finds the allegations relating to the May 26, 2017 incident are Sustained. |

| COPA finds that Allegations 11 and 12 that on May 24, 2017 Lt. Peabody pushed and purposely struck her with a door on her upper body are Sustained. alleged that after an argument about the children's lunches, Lt. Peabody pushed her out of the bedroom. When she attempted go back into the bedroom, Lt. Peabody slammed the door on her body near her upper shoulder. account of this incident was consistent when she told Ms. that Lt. Peabody tried to push her out of the bedroom and slammed the door on her arm. Lt. Peabody denied these allegations only recalling an incident in September 2017 that took place after this incident was reported to COPA. noted in her police report for the May 26, 2017 incident that there were other physical altercations, including one on May 24, 2017. Given account of the incident was consistent when told to COPA and to Ms. COPA finds that this allegation is supported by a preponderance of the evidence, and it is Sustained. |
| COPA finds that Allegations 13 and 14 that on May 1, 2017 Lt. Peabody twisted arm/wrist and pressed her against the footboard of the bed with his foot are Sustained. related that on this date, when she attempted to take an iPad away from the children, Lt. Peabody grabbed her arm and twisted it, placing her in a wrist lock. When she broke free and attempted to step over him on the bed to reach for the iPad, he used his foot to pin her upper outer thigh against the base of the bed. Ms. recalled that called her on the date of that incident and related a similar account. Lt. Peabody denies the incident stating climbed on top of him but that he had no physical contact with her. Again, given account of the incident was consistent when told to COPA and to Ms. COPA finds that this allegation is supported by a preponderance of the evidence, and it is Sustained. |

VI. RECOMMENDED DISCIPLINE FOR SUSTAINED ALLEGATIONS

This investigation determined that Lt. Peabody engaged in domestic violence on 3 separate occasions.³⁰ COPA has considered the delay in this investigation and the lack of injuries. COPA has also considered Lt. Peabody's behavior and his lack of personal accountability for this incident. The only mitigation is Lt. Peabody's complimentary history and lack of prior discipline. Therefore, COPA recommends suspension and Anger Management.³¹
