## SUMMARY REPORT OF INVESTIGATION I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA) requested an Affidavit Override<sup>1</sup> that was approved and hence this investigation proceeded. This investigation involved domestic allegations made by the victim, **Sector** against the accused, Sergeant Anton White. The investigation revealed that Ms. **Sector** contacted the police on two separate occasions, February 16, 2018 and October 23, 2016 to report complaints against Sgt. White.

On February 16, 2018, Ms. Called the police and the responding supervisor properly documented the incident and initiated this investigation. Despite the repeated attempts, Ms. Called the responding officers and the interviews were captured on the Body Worn Camera (BWC)<sup>2</sup> of the responding officers. Ms. Called Sgt. White of forcibly placing his face and body on her, grabbing her neck and pulling her off the sofa and wrestling her to the floor. Ms. Called the floor and Sgt. White on top of her. Ms. Called the aring a commotion and discovered content on the floor and Sgt. White on top of her. Ms. Called the medical records related that Ms. Called the floor and landed on her abdomen. Ms. Called the floor her knee, lower back, abdomen and was diagnosed with a knee sprain and pelvic pressure.

On October 23, 2016, Ms. **Sector** also called the police and Sergeant Raymond Boyd responded to the scene and his Body Worn Camera (BWC)<sup>3</sup> video captured him informing another officer that this incident was involving an off-duty police officer. The OEMC Event Query #1629701955<sup>4</sup> reported this was a domestic disturbance involving an off-duty police officer that was reported to be intoxicated. The video captured Sgt. Boyd walking up to the house and being greeted by Sgt. White. Sgt. Boyd and Sgt. White reentered the house to speak with Ms. **Sector** who related that she wanted Sgt. White to return her keys back and leave. Sgt. White handed Ms. **Sector** the keys and proceeded to leave the house. Sgt. Boyd is heard asking Ms. **Sector** "There's nothing else

you want done?"<sup>5</sup> and Sgt. White stated, "No she don't want anything." Sgt. Boyd then exits the residence with Sgt. White and turns off his BWC. A search revealed that Sgt. Boyd failed to initiate a complaint and properly document the incident. Ms.

## V. INVESTIGATION a. Interviews

Attempts made by COPA to schedule for an interview and sign a sworn affidavit were met with negative results. Although, Ms. did not provide a statement, her account of the incident was obtained through Body Worn Camera (BWC)<sup>10</sup>,<sup>11</sup> video that captured interviews between Ms. did not provide a statement, Sgt. Anton White of Forcibly placing his face and body on her, grabbing her neck and pulling her off the sofa and wrestling her to the floor. Ms. discussion of her bedroom and observed Sgt. White on top of discuss. Ms. discussion of plain to her left knee and was observed limping. Ms. discussion of fered medical assistance by the responding officers and Ms. discussion of the sofa and was a nurse and would seek treatment on her own at West Suburban Medical Center.

Ms. Main also related that on a previous occasion, she called the police and reported that Sgt. White was intoxicated and acting belligerent. An OEMC address search revealed that on October 23, 2016, Ms. Main did call the police and it was reported under OEMC Event Query<sup>12</sup> that Sgt. White was intoxicated and at her front door. The BWC<sup>13</sup> showed Sergeant Raymond Boyd responding to the scene and talking to Ms. More that she was fine and requested that Sgt. White return her keys. Sgt. White denied having any keys, but then handed Ms. More the keys. Sgt. Boyd asked Ms. More that a gesture that was not captured on the video. Sgt. Boyd then exits the residence with Sgt. White and turns off his BWC.

In an interview with COPA<sup>15</sup>, on December 3, 2019, Sergeant Anton White #1040 related that had lived together for about three years. Sgt. White related that on October he and 23, 2016, at approximately 2:00 am, he went to Ms. **Solution** home and discovered that she was home with a friend named Sgt. White related that he and Ms. got into an argument being in the house. Ms. requested that Sgt. White leave her house and return over her house keys. Sgt. White related that he still had personal items in the house and Ms. threatened to call the police if he did not return the keys. Sgt. White refused to return the keys and while leaving the house, Sgt. White was met by the responding officers. Sgt. White was greeted by the responding sergeant, now known as Sergeant Raymond Boyd. Sgt. White briefly informed Sgt. Boyd that he and Ms. **Mathematical set of the set** had requested that he return her keys. Sgt. White and Sgt. Boyd reentered the house and Sgt. White returned the house keys to Ms. Sgt. White was shown the OEMC Event Query<sup>16</sup> that indicated that Ms. **Set up** had reported him as being intoxicated and causing a disturbance. Sgt.

White denied being intoxicated or being belligerent toward Ms. However, Sgt. White admitted to engaging in a verbal disagreement with Ms. However, Sgt. White admitted to engaging in a verbal disagreement with Ms. However, Sgt. White ultimately caused the police to respond. Sgt. White was asked to explain the differences between disagreement and altercation and said, "Verbal disagreement, yes. Verbal altercation in my mind, I think is loud, back and forth, just, like, can get violent, just threats can be made."<sup>17</sup> Sgt. White related that sometime in 2017, he and Ms.

Sgt. White related that on February 16, 2018, he and Ms. **Second** did engage in another verbal disagreement, but could not recall what the argument was about. Sgt. White denied all the allegations that he grabbed Ms. **Second** by her neck and pulled her off the sofa, forcibly placed his body and face on her and wrestled her onto the floor. Sgt. White related that Ms. **Second** was home in her bedroom but could not recall if she heard the argument. He got tired of arguing and left the house. Sgt. White was later informed by his lieutenant that a report had been made against him. Sgt. White was shown Original Case Incident Report (JB154958)<sup>18</sup> that reported Sgt. White grabbing Ms. **Second** by the neck and pulling her to the floor. Sgt. White related that he was unaware that Ms. **Second** had received medical treatment and had no knowledge of her injuries.

In an **interview with COPA<sup>19</sup>** on November 22, 2019, Sergeant Raymond Boyd #14299 viewed his Body Worn Camera (BWC) video that was related to a domestic disturbance that he responded on October 23, 2016. Prior to arriving on the scene, Sgt. Boyd was aware that the incident was involving an off-duty officer. Upon arrival, Sgt. Boyd was greeted outside by the involved officer, now known as Sergeant Anton White. Sgt. Boyd was told by Sgt. White that everything was fine and proceeded to follow Sgt. White back inside the house. Sgt. Boyd briefly spoke to a lady, now known as **sergeant** and asked her if everything was fine. Ms. **solution** told Sgt. Boyd that she wanted her keys back and for Sgt. White to leave her house. Sgt. Boyd was shown the OEMC Event query<sup>20</sup> which reported Sgt. White to be intoxicated. Sgt. Boyd related that he did not recall reading the remark on the query. Sgt. Boyd did not observe Sgt. White to be intoxicated and was unaware of the allegation that Sgt. White had been accused of being intoxicated.

Sgt. Boyd was shown a copy of Domestic Incidents, General Order 04-04<sup>21</sup> and was read section III, B, which stated "If a Chicago Police Department member is involved in the domestic incident, the responding member will request that a member who is of higher rank than the Department member involved in the domestic incident be assigned from the district of occurrence as the investigating supervisor." Sgt. Boyd admitted that he failed to comply with the order. Sgt. Boyd related that he had been recently promoted to sergeant and was unaware of that provision in the order.

Sgt. Boyd was shown a copy of Special Situations Involving Allegations of Misconduct, Special Order 08-01-02<sup>22</sup> and was read section II, E, 1 thru 3 which outlined allegations of impairment and defined alcohol intoxication. Sgt. Boyd admitted that he did not comply with this order and failed to notify the station supervisor, prepare an Initiation Report, ensure To-From-Subject reports were obtained from each of the responding officers who had knowledge of the incident and prepare a To-From-Subject report summarizing the investigation. Sgt. Boyd did not observe Sgt. White to be impaired and was unaware of the allegation of intoxication made against Sgt. White.

Sgt. Boyd was also shown a copy of Domestic Incidents, Special Order 04-04<sup>23</sup> and was read section III, B, 4, which stated, "Bureau of Patrol field supervisors will obtain CR number and follow the procedures outlined in the Department directive entitled "Complaint and Disciplinary Procedures" if a Department member is involved in the domestic incident and crime/misconduct by the Department is alleged." Sgt. Boyd admitted that he also failed to comply with this order because he was unaware of any misconduct against Sgt. White.

### **b.** Digital Evidence

**Body Worn Camera** (**BWC**)<sup>24</sup> video showed that on February 16, 2018, numerous units responded to a domestic disturbance at Body Worn Camera (BWC) of Officer Rosali Perez Jr. and Sergeant Denis O'Keefe captured Ms. Camera (BWC) of accusing her exboyfriend, Sergeant Anton White of forcibly placing his face and body on her face, grabbing her by the neck and pulling her off the sofa, and wrestling her to the floor. Ms.

and observed **and a complete and Set** white on top of her. Ms. **Complete and Set** and she refused. Ms. **Complete and Set** white on top of her. Ms. **Complete and Set** and ambulance and she refused. Ms. **Complete and Set** stated that she is a nurse and will obtain treatment on her own. Ms. **Complete and Set** and acting belligerent. An OEMC address search revealed that on October 23, 2016, Ms. **Complete and Set** and reported Sgt. White to be intoxicated and at her front door.

**Body Worn Camera** (**BWC**)<sup>25</sup> video shows on October 23, 2016, numerous units responding to a domestic disturbance at Body Worn Camera (BWC) of Officer Adrian Flores, Officer Robert McDonald and Sergeant Raymond Boyd captured the officers arriving on the scene. Upon arrival, Sgt. Boyd is overheard informing another officer that a PDT received indicated that the involved was an off-duty police officer. As Sgt. Boyd walks toward the house, Sgt. White is observed exiting the house and walking towards Sgt. Boyd. Sgt. White identified himself as a sergeant from Area 2 and explained that he was there talking to his ex-girlfriend, and her new boyfriend. Sgt. White stated that he was having an issue, but that everything was okay. Sgt. White is observed re-entering the residence and is

followed by Sgt. Boyd inside the house. Sgt. White approaches Ms. **Set White** and has a few words and turns around to leave. At that point, Sgt. Boyd stops Sgt. White and asked Ms. **Set White** everything was okay. Ms. **Set White** said that Sgt. White could leave, but she just wanted her keys returned to her. At first, Sgt. White said that he did not have the keys and then pulled out some keys and handed them to Ms. **Set White** Sgt. Boyd then asked Ms. **Set White** 'S nothing else you want done?''<sup>26</sup> and Sgt. White replied, "No she don't want anything." Sgt. White is observed exiting the house followed by Sgt. Boyd who turns off his BWC.

**OMEC 911 audio call**<sup>27</sup> indicated that **Constant of Second Seco** 

### c. Documentary Evidence

The **Initiation Report**,<sup>28</sup> authored by Sergeant Denis O'Keefe, detailed the initial investigation into a Domestic Incident Report that involved Yolonda and her ex-boyfriend, Sergeant Anton White. On February 16, 2018, Sgt. O'Keefe responded to the scene and was informed that Sgt. White was no longer on the scene. Ms. **Sergeant** related that Sgt. White became aggressive and repeatedly placed his face onto Ms. **Sergeant** face. Sgt. White grabbed Ms. **Sergeant** by her neck and pulled her off the couch and onto the floor. Ms. **Sergeant** sustained injury to her knee and was observed limping and in pain. Ms. **Sergeant** was inside her bedroom when she heard the argument which drew her out to investigate and called the police.

The **Original Case Incident Report**<sup>29</sup> **for JB154958**, authored by Officer Rosali Perez Jr. described a Domestic Battery investigation involving Yolonda and Sergeant Anton White. The report described Sgt. White grabbing Ms. **Compared a** around her neck and pulling her down onto the floor and causing injury to her left knee. Ms. **Complained of pain but refused medical treatment**. Ms. **Complained of pain but refused medical treatment** heard the commotion and told Sgt. White to leave and that she was calling the police.

The **Case Supplementary Report<sup>30</sup> for JB154958**, authored by Detective Charles Van Develde III, related that the investigation was classified as Exceptionally Cleared Closed because Ms. **Second** refused to prosecute. Details about the incident, included a summary interview of Ms. **Second** who related being in a relationship with Sgt. White for the past six years and had recently broken up. Ms. **Second** related that Sgt. White appeared at her house and was upset because she had not called him after the death of Commander Paul Bauer. Sgt. White told Ms. **Second** that she was insensitive because she did not call or check on him. The argument escalated when Sgt. White grabbed Ms. **Second** by her neck and pulled her onto the floor. In the process, Ms. **Second** left knee struck the floor causing injury. Ms. **Second** took herself to West Suburban Medical Center and was diagnosed with a torn meniscus to her left knee.

Supervisor's Management Log,<sup>33</sup> authored by Sergeant Raymond Boyd, indicated that he responded to a Domestic Disturbance at the residence of the service of

**Medical Records from West Suburban Medical Center**<sup>34</sup> indicated that on February 17, 2018, at approximately 7:17am, **Sector** received medical treatment and was diagnosed with a left knee sprain. On the night before, Ms. **Sector** was involved in an altercation and was pushed to the floor and landed on her abdomen. Ms. **Sector** twisted her left knee and complained of pain to her left knee, lower back and abdomen. Xray's taken of Ms. **Sector** left knee were normal and showed no bone, joint or soft tissue abnormalities. The report made no mention that Ms. **Sector** was involved in a domestic altercation.

## VI. LEGAL STANDARD

For each Allegation COPA must make one of the following findings:

- 1. <u>Sustained</u> where it is determined the allegation is supported by a preponderance of the evidence;
- 2. <u>Not Sustained</u> where it is determined there is insufficient evidence to prove the allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- 3. <u>Unfounded</u> where it is determined by clear and convincing evidence that an allegation is false or not factual; or
- 4. <u>Exonerated</u> where it is determined by clear and convincing evidence that the conduct described in the allegation occurred, but it is lawful and proper.

A **preponderance of evidence** can be described as evidence indicating that it is **more likely than not** that the conduct occurred and violated Department policy. *See Avery v. State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Co.*, 216 III. 2d 100, 191 (2005), (a proposition is proved by a preponderance of the evidence when it has found to be more probably true than not). If the evidence gathered in an investigation establishes that it is more likely that the misconduct occurred, even if by a narrow margin, then the preponderance of the evidence standard is met.

**Clear and convincing evidence** is a higher standard than a preponderance of the evidence but lower than the "beyond-a-reasonable doubt" standard required to convict a person of a criminal offense. See *e.g.*, *People v. Coan*, 2016 IL App (2d) 151036 (2016). Clear and Convincing can be defined as a "degree of proof, which, considering all the evidence in the case, produces the firm and abiding belief that it is highly probable that the proposition . . . is true." *Id.* at ¶ 28.

## VI. ANALYSIS

Despite repeated attempts, refused to cooperate with this investigation and provide a formal statement. However, on February 16, 2018, Ms. did provide information about the incident to the responding officers and the interviews were captured on their Body Worn Camera (BWC). Ms. related having an argument with Sgt. White that escalated when Sgt. White forcibly placed his face and body on her, grabbed her neck and pulled her off the sofa and wrestled her to the floor. Ms. **Solution** obtained medical treatment on her own at West Suburban Medical Center and was diagnosed with a sprain left knee. The medical records reported Ms. involved in an altercation on the night before. Ms. was reported to have been pushed to the floor and landed on her abdomen. Ms. **Mathematical Second** twisted and injured her left knee and complained of pain to her knee, lower back and abdomen. Although, Sgt. White denies the allegations against him, the evidence obtained (BWC video and medical records) clearly indicate that Sgt. White did physically abuse Ms. **More than the set of the s** abuse was related by Ms. **Sector** and therefore, Allegations #1 must be Not Sustained and Allegations 2- #4, against Sgt. White, must be Sustained. Ms. Main also related in her interview with the responding officers about a previous incident in which she reported the police on Sgt. White. A search revealed that on October 23, 2016, Ms. did call the police and reported Sgt. White to be intoxicated, belligerent and causing a disturbance. The search revealed that Sergeant Raymond Boyd responded to the scene and his Body Worn Camera (BWC) captured his interviews with Ms. and Sgt. White. Sgt. White denies the allegations against him and described the altercation as a verbal disagreement. The BWC video does not corroborate that Sgt. White engaged in a verbal altercation with Ms. **Example 1** that he was belligerent towards her or that he was intoxicated, although Ms. **Mathematicate** did allege that in her 911 call. Therefore, **Allegations #5** - #7, against Sgt. White, are Not Sustained.

Sgt. Boyd was presented with allegations that on October 23, 2016, that he failed to initiate and properly document a domestic incident involving Sgt. White. Sgt. Boyd. He was shown and read provisions of General Orders and Special Orders that dictate how to respond to Domestic Incidents involving department members. Sgt. Boyd admitted that he failed to initiate a Complaint Register number and properly document the incident and therefore, **Allegation #1, against Sgt. Boyd, must be Sustained.** 

## VII. RECOMMENDED DISCIPLINE FOR SUSTAINED ALLEGATIONS

## c. Sgt. Anton White
