II. SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

Complainant alleges he was detained without justification, forcefully taken to the ground and verbally abused by officers of the Chicago Police Department. COPA reviewed CPD reports documenting the incident including an Investigatory Stop Report, Arrest Report, Tactical Response Report, and Original Case Incident Report, as well as Complainant Interview, Officer Hopkins' Accused Officer Interview, Officer Khalifeh's Accused Officer Interview, relevant Body Worn Camera recordings, cell phone videos submitted by POD camera video capturing the incident, an Office of Emergency Management Communications Event Query Report, CPD Attendance Assignment records, numerous photographs of following the arrest, and other related documents.

COPA finds that on June 14th, 2019 at approximately 11:22 AM, at or near 7058 S. Jeffery Blvd., Officer Hopkins and Officer Khalifeh encountered transacting business at the corner of E. 71St street and S. Jeffery Blvd. Officer Hopkins warned against conducting business at his table in the way of pedestrians. It is unclear whether Officer Hopkins' warning centered on the issue of obstructing pedestrian foot traffic, suspected unlicensed business transactions on the public way, or both. Soon after the initial stop, moved his table several feet north on Jeffery Blvd; while the officers continued to patrol the area.

At approximatly 12:15 PM, the officers pulled up in their vehicle on the street near table as he spoke with pedestrians on the sidewalk. The approached the vehicle and words were exchanged between and at least one occupant of the police vehicle. As the officers remained in their vehicle, the returned and moved the table and his other possessions several more feet north on S. Jeffery Street. More words were exchanged between and at least one occupant of the vehicle. The returned to his conversation with the nearby pedestrians. Officer Hopkins exited the vehicle, approached and asked him several times for identification. After Officer Hopkins' third or fourth request for identification, took two or three steps backward pulling himself away from Officer Hopkins. Officer Hopkins placed his right hand on the left arm. The continued to pull away and repeatedly shouted "Why are you touching me?" Officer Hopkins continued to ask repeatedly for

identification. Officer Khalifeh exited the police vehicle and approached and Officer Hopkins.

A struggle then ensued between and Officer Hopkins, and Officer Hopkins proceeded to position himself behind attempting to pull his arms behind his back, saying, "Put your hands behind your back." repeatedly shouted and pulled away as Officer Hopkins attempted to gain control of Officer Hopkins and continued toward his police vehicle. As the two to struggle as Officer Hopkins attempted to walk struggled into the street near oncoming vehicular and pedestrian traffic, attempted to jerk his body away from Officer Hopkins' control and Officer Hopkins took ground, falling on top of him on the street near the intersection. Officer Hopkins and Officer Khalifeh secured in handcuffs and walked him to their vehicle, placing him in the backseat. The officers then placed possessions in their vehicle, transported him to the 3rd District Station, and began processing was charged by police with a Chicago Municipal Code violation of soliciting business on a public way, as well as the State of Illinois crime of resisting a peace officer.

III. ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSION

COPA finds the allegation that Officer Hopkins detained without justification exonerated. Video evidence captures soliciting and/or transacting business with pedestrians on the sidewalk near 7058 S. Jeffery Blvd., giving Officer Hopkins legal cause to investigate Mr. Hopkins for violation of Chicago Municipal Code sections regarding street vendors, transacting business on the public way and obstructing pedestrian foot traffic. As Officer Hopkins repeatedly asked for identification, did not comply and began stepping away from Officer White, justifying Officer Hopkins in detaining in order to safely complete the investigation. Then continued to pull away from and struggle against Officer Hopkins as the two struggled into the street. Thus, committed the offense of resisting a peace officer and an emergency takedown within CPD policy resulted. Therefore, COPA finds the allegation that Officer Hopkins detained without justification exonerated.

COPA does not sustain allegations that Officer Khalifeh verbally abused him by stating words to the effect of "motherfucker" and "we fucking told you before, move the fucking table." No available video evidence captures any verbal interaction specifically between Officer Khalifeh and prior to arrest. Of the very few verbal interactions between Officer Khalifeh and captured on Body Worn Camera during and after arrest, at no point is Officer Khalifeh captured stating words to the effect of those alleged by During their interviews with COPA, neither Officer Khalifeh nor Officer Hopkins recalled any verbal interaction taking place between Officer Khalifeh and prior to the arrest, stating instead that the verbal interactions took place between Officer Hopkins and Due to the absence of any recording capturing an earlier interaction during which verbal abuse by Officer Khalifeh is alleged to have occurred, as well as the absence of any admission on the part of Officer Khalifeh or Officer Hopkins that Officer Khalifeh engaged in such verbal abuse, COPA can neither sustain nor exonerate the allegations. Therefore, COPA finds the allegations that Officer Khalifeh engaged in verbal abuse of
