Re: Superintendent's Partial Concurrence with COPA's Findings and Partial Concurrence
with Penalty Recommendations

Dear Chief Administrator White:

After a careful review of the above referenced complaint log number, the Chicago Police Department (Department) partially concurs with the recommended sustained findings and partially concurs with the penalty recommendations, as it pertains to Officer Cornelius Davis, Star No. 16503 and Officer Nan Yun, Star No. 15478. Pursuant to the Municipal Code of Chicago, the Department provides the following comments:

The COPA investigation recommended a 11-29 day suspension for Officer Cornelius Davis after concluding that he:

1. It is alleged that on November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused engaged in misconduct through the following acts and/or omissions: Impeded and/or inhibited an investigation by failing to properly identify himself as a CPD member.
2. On November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused attempted to forcibly enter an Airbnb by using feet and/or hands to strike the front door.
3. On November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused threatened and/or intimidated occupants of an Airbnb by using feet and/or hands to strike the front door.
4. On November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused engaged in an unjustified verbal altercation with [REDACTED]
5. On November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused engaged in an unjustified verbal altercation with [REDACTED]

The COPA investigation recommended a Reprimand for Officer Nan Yun after concluding that he:

1. It is alleged that on November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused engaged in misconduct through the following acts and/or omissions: Failure to maintain control of the scene of a domestic incident.
2. It is alleged that on November 10, 2024, at approximately 12:52 am, at or near 957 W. 35th Street, the accused engaged in misconduct through the following acts and/or omissions: Failure to complete an investigation of a domestic incident.

The Department concurs with all the allegations for Officer Davis and will implement an 11-day suspension.

However, the Department does not concur with allegation one and two for Officer Yun. In this case, one of the complainants stated to Davis "please leave." Attachment #18 at 3:48. The complainant also told Officer Yun and his partner that "[Davis] needs to go." Attachment #18 at 3:24. Officer Yun also clarifies with the complainant and says "What do you want to do ma'am?" Attachment #18 at 5:00. The complainant responds "I want this documented." Attachment #18 at 5:04. Therefore, it was not unreasonable for Officer Yun to believe the complainants wanted Davis to leave and case report to provide to Airbnb.

Officer Yun and his partner obtained all the necessary information and provided the complainants a case report for the damaged door. Officer Yun and his partner told the complainants if Davis came back, he would be arrested. For these reasons the Department does not concur with allegation one and two and believes the finding of Unfounded should be the proper finding for the allegations against Officer Yun.

The Department looks forward to discussing this matter with you pursuant to MCC-2-78-130(a)(iii).
